### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

In Owls Class this week, the children have focused on shape in maths. They have loved investigating and drawing shapes, manipulating shapes to build castles and houses, making shape pizzas, and tangram pictures.



They have looked at how shapes are similar and how they are different, describing the number of corners and edges each one has. *I wonder if you can spot any shapes around the house this weekend Owls?* 

In Drawing Club, the children have thoroughly enjoyed listening to the story of The Gingerbread Man. The new vocabulary has been: jolly, soggy, scurry, leap, pursue, cunning and topple. In our class story, the bakers decided to bake cakes instead of Gingerbread men as these can't run away so on Wednesday we also decided to make our own cakes, linking it to our maths topic of shape!

Continuing with our theme of travel and transport, the children enjoyed thinking about travelling around the world linked to the story '*Charlie's Superhero Underpants!*' They used the Beebots to program journeys, trying to visit all the different countries that Charlie had on his quest to find his underpants!

Next week we will be focusing on trains as our form of transport to link with our trip to Bickleigh Railway Centre which we are all very excited about!

Please can you ensure that your child brings a refillable water bottle to school with them every day. We do have some spares in case of emergencies but we don't like to make a habit of this as we need to avoid sharing germs!

## Year 1— Mrs Keast & Mr Saltearn

This week in English we have been writing our own set of instructions. We have been writing instructions for making a bug hotel. We based this on our experience of making them with Darcie's Mum Leanne earlier in the year. We ended the week by making our own "worm world" wormery. Next week we will be independently writing a set of instructions for making a wormery.

In Maths we have been learning about quarters and have been splitting shapes and quantities into four. We remembered that the four parts must be equal and not every number can be shared between four equally. Next week we will be learning about position and direction.

In RE we learned about the Jewish celebration of Shabbat. We saw how families get ready for Shabbat and looked at the objects that are used in the celebration. We were surprised to learn about some of the things that Jewish children are not allowed to do during Shabbat, including watching TV and writing!

We are excited for our trip next week - hopefully the weather will be dry for us. Please remember your bucket and spade for the sculpture making!

## Year 2—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mr Saltearn

This week, Year 2 have continued their learning about time, they have been telling the time to the hour and looking at how many minutes are in an hour and hours in a day, comparing different amounts of time.

In English, we have continued our learning on '*Stella and the Seagull*' and have compared the similarities and differences between our book and *'Dear Greenpeace'*.

In Science, the children carried out an experiment to see how we can change the forms of different materials.

In PE we have been practicing our athletics for sports day, looking specifically at the long jump.

The children started to build their 3D fish sculptures in art and next week we will make them into a 3D model and evaluate how they have turned out.

## Year 3-Mr Slocombe

What a brilliant week in Year 3! In English, we have completed our '*Big Book of Blooms*' of sequence, publishing and illustrating our writing. We have thoroughly enjoyed this unit and it has been brilliant to connect up our science and writing learning.

Maths has seen us tell the time to the nearest 5-minutes and the nearest minute, using this to calculate the duration of events.

In science, we considered the life cycle of a flowering plant, drawing and annotating a diagram to show this. The children were able to use their knowledge from Rosemoor and our writing to inform their learning.

Meanwhile, in geography, we thought about the similarities and differences between physical features of Poland and the United Kingdom, comparing the Tatra Mountains with the Lake District.

RE saw us consider ways that Jesus impacts Christians lives, through charity, love and respect.

Have a super weekend and I look forward to seeing you all next week for our final week of Summer 1!

## Year 4—Miss McLean

This week in maths, Year Four have been working on converting times between analogue and digital times including 12 and 24-hours.

In English, we have been getting to know the book 'Outdoor Wonderland' by using some pages from the book as inspiration to practice the grammar features, we have previously covered.

In science on Monday, we categorised and identified living things using a dichotomous key. The children practiced asking yes or no questions to work out which animal their partner was thinking about.

We learnt that a capital city is the city that the country is governed from and then had a go at finding the capital cities in North America. We then moved on to compare Devon and Mexico City by looking at the difference in area and population.

Finally, in art on Wednesday, the children planned their sculpture that they will make next week taking inspiration from the artist Alexander Calder.

## Year 5-Mr Walter

This week Year 5 have been planning their own adventure story in English. Thinking carefully about characters and settings before giving greater detail of the friends, foes and ordeals they will face along the way. Creating some fantastic animal based characters whilst using their learnt grammatical techniques to help build suspense.

In maths, we have started our next sequence focussing on position and direction. We have enjoyed recapping how to read and plot coordinates by playing battleships against our face partners. This has allowed us to explore the first quadrant before delving deeper into the other three. Our sustainable work this week involved us researching a chosen companies sustainability plan. Writing them a letter to detail what they are already doing and asking how they are going to achieve their goals. We also gave advice of ways we thought they could lower their carbon footprint further.

Well done to everyone at our trip on Thursday! First, we went to Exeter City Football Stadium, this allowed us to tour the stadium. Our volunteer tour guides detailed the history as we explored the different rooms and areas of the ground. Everyone was excited to see who they could recognise in the pictures as we walked around. Particular excitement came from wearing signed shirts and handling memorabilia in the museum and sitting in the home changing rooms. Secondly, we walked to Exeter Mosque. This linked with our previous RE sequence of learning. It was fantastic to be welcomed into the religious setting whilst understanding a different culture. We were amazed that the Iman could recite the Quran from cover to cover and enjoyed listening and watching the call to prayer. Everyone respected and listened amazingly throughout the day (Even on a march from one Exeter train station to the other).

# ATTENDANCE



#### What does the law say about attendance?

By law, all children of compulsory school age (between 5 and 16 yrs) must get a suitable, full-time education. As a parent **you are responsible** for making sure this happens. Parents and carers commit an offence if a child does not attend school regularly and the absence is not agreed by the school.

#### Will an absence be authorised by the school?

Schools can only agree absences for a limited range of exceptional circumstances, these are typically absences that are completely unavoidable. Absences that will not be agreed might include:

- · Arrival after registers have closed.
- · Absences that are not properly explained.
- · Day trips and holidays in term time.

· Leaving the school without school authorisation during the day. Repeated unauthorised absences may be referred to Devon County Council for Parent Responsibility measures to improve attendance.

#### Who can help you?

Do not be afraid to ask for help if a problem arises. Parents and carers should reach out to the school to explore how they can support and/ or contact other services available to help.

#### "We are only a few minutes late" - Does it matter?

Being late for school reduces learning time and does not prepare your child or young person for their future working lives

- · Arrival 5 minutes late every day = 3 days of learning missed each year
- Arrival 15 minutes late every day = 10 days or 2 weeks of learning each year.

- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
