#### Preschool



## THE LEARNING ZONE



SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 1

We have had another lovely week in Class 1, ending with our first Forest School day this Summer. We all enjoyed being back in the forest, especially making the annual S'mores! The children also created their own versions of Andrew Goldsworthy's nature sculptures, completing their Art unit of work from last half term. This week, Reception have been learning about the life cycle of a butterfly, using the lovely text, A Very Hungry Caterpillar. They have been comparing this to the life cycle of a frog, recapping the days of the week as well as learning and using some new vocabulary. During Maths activities, they have been learning how to double numbers to 10. They have done this by creating symmetrical butterflies using paints, playing doubling games and making bead necklaces.

In English, Year 1 and 2 have been continuing their work on Mrs Armitage and the Big Wave. They have created their own noun phrases using adjectives and have adding further information to sentences using a variety of conjunctions. They have also started to think about a story they could write, that also has a cumulative structure. In Maths, Year 1 have continued their work on Fractions by learning how to recognise and find guarters using pictures, shapes, objects and numbers. Year 2 have been developing their problem solving skills by continuing to investigate numbers. They have been set problems to work on, using their knowledge and understanding of the four operations of mathematics.

In other lessons, the children have been learning about Florence Nightingale and her significance to nursing, tasting and preparing a variety of different fruits and completing a science investigation together on body patterns.

We all enjoyed the Father's Day breakfast event on Thursday and we hope you did too. Thank you for your continued support.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 2

A busy week in Class 2 this week.

The sun has been out and the children have coped well with the heat. In English, we have finished our sequence on "A River" and the children created their own version of the story following the same pattern as the book. They have started their new sequence on "Earth Verse" and have been experimenting writing their Haikus. We have built our own success criteria on how to write a Haiku that we will use when we write our own Haiku book at the end of the sequence.

In History, the children looked at the phrase Kings and queens used to rule as absolute monarchs, with complete control over how the country was run, giving their thoughts about the statement and created a poster for their folder including people's responses. They thought about what they would do if they were a King or Queen for the day.

In PE the children have been practicing their jumping and preparing for Sports day.

Last week Year 5 and 6 had their last forest school of the school year and the last one for our Year 6 children. Thank you Mrs Blacker for all your hard work over the year and I know the children are already excited for next year.

In Spanish, this week Years 3 and 4 have been asking about what pets people have and continued to speak about their families. Years 5 and 6 have started to look at their project this year and will be organising a holiday to a Spanish speaking country. Today the children have been practicing booking accommodation.

# Should I keep my child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scables	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
