SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 1—Mrs Godly

It has been great to see everyone again after our half term break.

This week, Reception have been learning some new phonemes and practising how to write the graphemes. They have been very busy with other activities. They have been thinking about Halloween, inventing their own magic potions, learning about Diwali and having a go at writing some descriptive words for autumn leaves. In Maths, they have been finding different ways to make the numbers 1, 2 and 3, as well as learning about subitising- *don't count, show the amount!*

In English, Years 1 and 2 have started a sequence using *Ellsworth's Extraordinary Electric Ears* by *Valerie Fisher*. This is a book that explores twenty-six amazing alphabet worlds, where every picture tells a tale! The children have enjoyed singing the Alphabet Song and I am sure they would love to do this at home with you as well. In lessons, they have been looking at the interesting and unusual vocabulary used in the book, using objects in the classroom to create their own noun phrases and learning about adverbs.

In Maths, Year 1 have been using fact families to develop their understanding of adding and subtracting numbers to ten. They have been using number tracks to help them do this. Year 2 have been subtracting 2- digit numbers. They have used Base 10 and hundred squares to support their learning.

Other lessons have included discussing what we know about explorers and exploring, creating a short dance based on leaves falling in autumn, investigating fridge magnets and finding out about Hanukkah.

The class loved having a non-uniform day on Thursday and everyone thoroughly enjoyed the FOKN Halloween Disco. Thank you to the Friends for organising it!

Class 2—Mr Saltearn

A busy first week back! It has been fantastic to welcome back the children this week.

We have started our new teaching sequences and in English have been learning about our new book The Highwayman. Year 5 and 6 have been identifying the structure of the poem and have annotated around the poem. We have been identifying rhyming couplets, metaphors, similes, alliteration and repetition used within the poem. Years 3 and 4 have story mapped the poem and created their own story from the point of view of Tim.



In Maths, Years 3 and 4 have continued their learning on addition and subtraction and have been estimating and using the inverse to check calculations. Years 5 and 6 have been dividing using short division.

We have started our new topics in Science and Years 3 and 4 have started their learning about States of Matter and have been identifying particles of solids, liquids and gases.

Sadly due to the weather Mrs Blacker had to make the tough decision to cancel forest school.

Lastly, we would like to say a massive 'Thank You' to Mr and Mrs Hawkins for providing the funds for our new football kit.

Should I keep my child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
