#### **Severe Weather Guidelines**

Wherever possible, the school will remain open during severe weather but our primary consideration is the safety of the children and staff. Heavy snowfall, or even icy roads, may mean that roads are impacted. It may also result in teachers not being able to get to school or are late.

In the event of severe weather, the school will take steps to determine the extent of the problem. If the situation seems to be deteriorating and causing potential problems, for children needing to travel some distance home, then steps will be taken to send those children home early.

Please make sure you have plans in place to pick up your child from school as soon as you receive a text or email informing you if the school needs to close early due to poor weather conditions. Staff need to be able to travel home safely and can only do so once all pupils have been collected.

Please make sure that the school knows what your early closure contingency plan is, for example if a different adult may need to collect your child/ren in this situation.

If there is any likelihood of severe weather, and you are not going to be at home, please ensure that the school knows who you wish them to contact should the children need to go home early by emailing or ringing the office. If you have any concerns, please ring the school office for advice.

In the event of it being necessary to close the school, every attempt will be made to notify parents via email, text message, the school website, the school Facebook page and you can also sign up for notification of school closures via this link Devon County Council (govdelivery.com).

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS



### Class 1 - Mrs Godly

It has been great to see all the children back in school after the Christmas holidays and we hope you all had a good break. Everybody has returned with excitement and have made a great start to the term.

This week, Reception have been working with the book, We're Going on a Bear Hunt by Michael Rosen. They have made a physical map of the family's route and drawn a story map. They have discussed winter and the clothes we wear during this season and have thought about special or safe places that they like to go too. In Maths, they have been comparing and investigating numbers to 5 using more, less and the same amounts as each number.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have started learning about traditional tales using the story Little Red Riding Hood by Nosy Crow texts. They have sequenced the story, created their own story maps and have been using the story and characters to write their own statements and questions about it. In Maths, Year 1 have been learning and using their number bonds to 20 to help them with addition. Year 2 have been recapping 'groups of', 'lots of' and arrays as well as moving on to multiplication sentences using the x symbol.

In other lessons, the children have been making shapes with their bodies, learning about life processes and how we can tell if something is living or not and we visited St James's church to see some of the artefacts in there and think about why they are important to Christians.

A busy and tiring week, but lots of fun!

### Class 2 - Mr Saltearn

A busy week in Class 2 this week! I

n PE we have been practicing our flight using our new spring board and controlling our landings. We practiced our footwork leading up to take off and then landing on two feet and holding that position. The children really enjoyed the extra spring from the spring board.

In English, we have continued our sequence on Harry Potter and a History of magical objects and have started to construct and engaging introduction to our objects ready for when we create our own book. I

n Maths, Years 3 and 4 have been practicing multiplying and dividing larger numbers, using part whole models. In Year 5 and 6 we have been finishing our sequence on fractions and the children have been multiplying and dividing fractions by integers.

We started our sequence on Rivers in Geography and Years 3 and 4 learnt about the different features of a river and created their own diagram of a river labelling the different parts, while Years 5 and 6 are using an atlas to locate world famous rivers before creating a fact file on a river of their choosing. I

n Science we have been learning about circuits and the children learnt about scientific symbols for drawing circuits and then Years 3 and 4 identified the role of a switch in a circuit and experimented adding switches into a circuit. Years 5 and 6, identified issues with circuits before ex-

plaining how they would fix them.

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.

It takes less than a minute to apply.
