Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

We have had a very busy week in Owls Class this week and the children have all been so engaged and ready to learn. We have started on our Guided reading journey this week and the children have all loved sharing a book together as a group. Next week we will be increasing the number of guided reading sessions to 3. By the time the book is uploaded onto the Collins e-book website they should be able to tell you lots about the story! We will move onto books containing words when the children are ready and understand the concept of segmenting words into phonemes and then blending these to read. I am sure this will not be long as they are so enthusiastic about learning new letters each day!

In maths this week we have been looking at things that are the same and things that are different. We had so much fun on a treasure hunt on Tuesday linked to a popular Percy Park Keeper story. The children have played a variety of lotto / snap and pairs games and particularly enjoyed setting up a tea party for the teddy bears ensuring each bear had exactly the same! **Perhaps you could play some matching games over the weekend Owls?**

As part of our R.E. work on Wednesday the children learnt about Christian Baptisms. They then thoroughly enjoyed carrying out their own Baptism ceremonies in the garden with the dolls! *We will be visiting our local church on Thursday next week to look at the features of a church and see a real font! Please ensure your child has a coat on this day.*

We had an impromptu cooking session on Thursday to use up lots of left over bananas! The children thoroughly enjoyed cooking and of course eating their banana cakes! Well done on all your hard work this week Owls. **Don't forget to share a book with someone over the weekend!**

















SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

This week we completed our English sequence based on 'Oi Frog!'. We created our own versions of the story using illustrations to help us plan. We had great fun trying to think of animals and foods that rhyme with them! Next week we begin a new sequence based on 'The Train Ride' by June Crebbin. This is a poem with the rhythm of a train chugging along the track.

In Maths we have also completed our first full sequence of learning about place value. We have been ordering numbers and objects this week before learning about ordinal numbers. We know how to use a number line and have discussed the position of numbers using mathematical vocabulary including more, less, greater, fewer.

In Geography this week we have been learning about our address and what the different parts of it mean, including the postcode. *Next week we hope to walk into the village and look at some of the main landmarks. We also hope to post home a letter from Winkleigh Post Office, please send in a self-addressed stamped envelope for this before Thursday 5th.*

This week's computing lesson taught us how to use a keyboard. We know that both laptop and desktop computers have a keyboard to allow us to type letters and numbers. We used paintZ.app to draw and type – this is a free web-based program which can be accessed at home if anyone would like to continue their learning!



Year 2—Miss Jones

In Maths this week we have come to the end of our learning on place value. We consolidated counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and used bead strings to count in 3s. We completed our elicitation task and have begun our new sequence on addition and subtraction.

On Friday we looked at fact families and recapped our learning about this from Year 1.

In English we have explored different areas of grammar, including nouns, verbs, conjunctions and expanded noun phrases. We are working hard on developing our writing stamina.

In Geography we worked collaboratively in our table teams to explore different countries to consider whether they are hot or cold. We applied our knowledge of world maps and the location of the equator in our presentations.

In Science we looked at microhabitats and thought about the different conditions that living things need to grow and survive. In Art we had a go at mixing the primary colours and used geometric shapes to trace and paint.

Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have enjoyed another busy week! We have begun our new sequence in English, based on the text 'Lord of the Forest'. The children have learnt actions to embed the structure of the text and considered their likes, dislikes, puzzles and patterns.

In maths, we have learnt about comparing and ordering numbers. Science saw us investigate the permeability of different types of rocks. In geography, we learnt about the different locations of various volcanoes, spotting and noticing patterns.

On Wednesday, we visited Exeter and we will use this experience as part of our learning in D&T and geography. It's fantastic to see lots of home reading and the children are more than welcome to record when they have read by themselves in their superstar reading record.

Year 4-Miss McLean

Year Four have worked extremely hard in English this week on their independent planning and writing. They have produced some fantastic persuasive letters to the characters in our focus book to persuade them not to chop down the rainforest. Next week, we will start a new poetry sequence using the book 'Poetry Pie'.

In maths we have come to the end of place value by looking at rounding. We practiced rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000. Next week we will begin learning about addition and subtraction by recalling our prior knowledge of the methods we can use for adding numbers with up to 4-digits.

We experimented with the states of matter in science and named the processes that happen when a material changes from one state to another. We melted some ice, butter and chocolate to find out what their melting points were.

In geography, we learnt about climate by comparing our climate with the rainforest's. We look at the patterns that we have with the seasons that we experience and compared that to the steady temperature that is experienced in the rainforest all year round. The children are all looking to our trip to the Eden Project next week where we will find out some more about what its like to live in the rainforest! Have a great weekend.

Year 5—Mr Walter

Well done this week Year 5! We started the week creating our own plan about a made up adventurer and finished by thinking clearly of how to edit our own independent writing. In maths, we have identified and discussed any misconceptions when adding and subtracting by defining our key vocabulary.

Elsewhere, in art we have used our research of artists to form a collage structure of our very own mountain and is PSHE we thought out what a recipe for a good friend was.

On Thursday, we enjoyed our first trip of the year to Ultimate Adventure, it was well worth the earlier start! Finally, thank you to all for attending and supporting our cake stall. Enjoy your weekend!



Year 6-Mr Davis

We have had another fantastic week in Year 6. In Maths, Year 6 have started their next sequence on the four operations. We have worked on addition and subtraction this week—focussing on reasoning skills and how they explain the choices that they make.



In English, we have continued with our sequence on Freedom Bird. The children have practised writing in the role of the characters, writing a recount of the events of the story and using subordinate clauses to vary their sentence staters and provide more information to the reader.

On Thursday, the children went on their first trip of the year to Ultimate Adventure. I am proud to say that their kindness, teamwork and bravery were clear for all to see and the instructors commented to all of the staff on how well the children behaved.



In RE this week, we looked at the Ten Commandments from the Judeo-Christian Bible and how they have effected laws in this country. We then thought about what commandments we would like to see if we were to write them ourselves.

Finally, in Science, the class conducted an experiment into the way shadows are formed and how they can be manipulated. We discussed the importance of a fair test and what measurements they were going to record and what they were going to change. It was a huge success. Have a lovely weekend!

- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less
