

### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Welcome new children

Establish behavioural expectations

Looking after each other and resources.

Talk about road safety rules and why they are important.

Children to create a system of sharing large-wheeled toys in the outside area so that it supports children to take turns.

Develop independence- shoes and coats off/on

### Physical Development

**Gross Motor**- Large wooden blocks to make ramps, ball skills-rolling, throwing and catching.

Action songs/rhymes.

**Fine Motor** - Threading and cutting skills, chalking roads outside, playdough rolling and twisting.

Cutting up fruit and vegetables.

### Communication and Language

Time to Talk activities

memory games, listening and joining in with stories, discussing nursery behavioural expectations, developing speaking and listening skills, learning new transport themed vocabulary. Small world play, themed songs and stories.

### Literacy

**Reading** - Listening, remembering and joining in with familiar stories.

**Key Texts**- 'We all go travelling by', 'The hundred decker bus', 'The train ride', 'We catch the bus', 'Me on the map' non fiction texts about vehicles.

Develop their phonological awareness, so that they can: • spot and suggest rhymes • count or clap syllables in a word- car, bus, submarine, aeroplane and motorbike.

**Writing** -Explore mark making equipment and apply meaning to their drawings. Drawing roads and maps

Making their own passports- drawing faces and writing their name.

### Maths

Learn number names and order through counting songs and finger rhymes.

Count different stimuli and learn to recognise groups of 1,2,3,4 and 5 objects.

### Understanding the World

Explore natural materials and respond to what they see in the world around them including seasonal changes.

Explore images of vehicles in the past and compare to the present.

Look at how we travel further- where would you like to go? How would you travel?
