Prior Knowledge

KS1- We have learnt about who to trust and who not to trust. We can seek advice from an adult to help us to resolve conflict. Regular hygiene routines are important to keep us safe. It is important to look after things that belong to us and other people. We know ways to look after ourselves and the environment.

KS2- We have learnt that there are key people who are responsible for keeping us safe. Different people in school and the community help us to stay safe. Every human being has rights and responsibilities. There is an impact on individuals and the wider community if responsibilities are not carried out. Volunteering can provide mental health and wellbeing benefits to people who choose to take part in it.





My Component Knowledge:

Lesson 1: I can define the terms 'fact', 'opinion', 'biased' and 'unbiased', explaining the difference between them.

Lesson 2: I know the legal age (and reason behind these) for having a social media account and understand why people don't tell the truth and often post only the good bits about themselves, online.

Lesson 3: I can explain some benefits of saving money and describe the different ways money can be saved, outlining the pros and cons of each method.
