Class 1—Mrs Godly

This week, Reception have started to learn some of the Phase 2 digraphs (such as qu and ch). They have been practising how to write and read these in words. In other activities, they have been learning about Remembrance Day, as well as finding out about Hanukkah. They had another lovely afternoon with Pre-school too, when they all tasted some Indian food such as samosas, mango chutney and special coconut sweets. They learnt Indian dancing and even dressed up in beautiful Indian costumes. In Maths, they have been investigating the composition of the numbers 1, 2 and 3 and finding more than and practising their number writing.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have started a new sequence using the book, *How to Catch Santa by Jean Reagan.* Although there are still a few weeks to Christmas, the children have really enjoyed writing a letter to Santa, thinking of questions they would like to ask him, as well as ways they could try to catch him. We had some very imaginative suggestions! In Maths, Year 1 have completed their unit of work on addition and subtraction and have started one on 2D and 3D shapes. They have been naming and recognising these as well as sorting them using different group titles. Year 2 have been continuing their work on Money. They have been comparing money and finding the total and difference in amounts of money.

In other lessons, the children have been finding out about Robert Falcon Scott, investigating puddles, and learning how to layer when making a badge. All the children are excited about seeing the pantomime on Monday with our friends at Winkleigh, which will be a great event.

Class 2—Mr Saltearn

A very busy week in Class 2 this week!

This week we have been planning our own narrative poems in the style of The Highwayman and the children have created their own narrative poems today from Tim's perspective.

In Maths, this week years 5 and 6 have been learning about the order of operations and have been using BIDMAS to solve different calculations. Years 3 and 4 have been learning about multiplying and dividing by 6 and 9 this week.

On Wednesday, we travelled to Exeter on the train, to take part in our Pizza Express workshop. The children all enjoyed making Pizzas and even had the chance to have a go at tossing the dough! They tasted fantastic! After our workshop we had the opportunity to explore RAMM and the children enjoyed looking at all the different exhibits. You can apply online at www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline from 15th November 2023 to the 15th January 2024

Even if you have already given details to a primary school, you must apply for a place through the Admissions Team. This is the only way to apply; other forms or lists held by schools will not count.

Should I keep my child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
