#### THE LEARNING ZONE

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS



Class 1 have been learning about the *Lord of the Forest* by Caroline Pitcher this week, they have been sequencing, role-playing and writing about the story from the point of view of the tiger. While reception have enjoyed creating their own stories based on *Jack and the Beanstalk*.

In maths, reception have been reading and learning the story of the *Hungry Caterpillar* and they have created their own caterpillars and been learning the days of the week. Year One have enjoyed learning about Measuring -- Mass and Capacity they have had lots of practical experience weighing with balance scales and using non-standard units. Year Two have been doing lots of practical measuring in centimetres and metres this week and have just started Mass, Capacity and Temperature. *I wonder what we measure in grams and millilitres?* 

In ICT this week, we have been looking at algorithms and programming Bee-Bots (floor robots). The children discovered that the instructions have to be very precise and in the correct order. *I wonder what is an algorithm?* 

In geography, the children made and used a compass. This then helped them to write directions using a map of the local area from a set point to their chosen destination.

The children have been thinking about why they are special in RE and writing sentences using 'because' to explain their reasoning.

The topic for science is Animals and the children have been looking at pets and why certain animals live freely in homes and why others do not.

### THE LEARNING ZONE





This week the class have been enjoying being outside more and even being on the field, finally!

In English, we have been reading the story *Kensuke's Kingdom* by Michael Morpurgo. The children are loving this book and the work they have been producing proves this. We have been looking at how the characters change and develop as the story progresses, using modal verbs to persuade a character to do something, creating a dialogue between two of the characters to practise our use of direct speech and regularly predicting what we think will happen next as the story unfolds.

Years 5 and 6 have just started a short Maths sequence on converting units. They have been using multiplication and division to convert between units of mass, capacity and length. Year 3 have been recapping fractions and Year 4 have been continuing with their learning about decimals.

Other lessons have included using atlases to locate and name all the countries of South America, learning about the digestive system (Years 3 and 4), what blood is used for and what it contains (Year 5 and 6), having a mini tag rugby tournament in PE and a day at Forest School for the Years 3, 4 and 5.

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
