The children have been making their own musical shakers, cutting out different sized dinosaurs and they enjoyed measuring the lengths of dinosaur footprints.

# THE LEARNING ZONE





This week, Reception have been concentrating on how to write some of the tricky words they have learnt in phonics, and how to write the digraphs and trigraphs they have learnt so far. They have listened to the story 'Raindrops to Rainbows' by John Micklos Jr and learnt the order of the colours of the rainbow. They have also enjoyed listening to the Year 1 and Year 2 books and joining in with learning the text by using actions.

In maths they have been looking at numbers 6,7 and 8. They have been practising how to write these numbers, looking at various pictorial representations of the numbers, matching these to the numeral, and making garages for 6,7,and 8 cars.

Years 1 and 2 have started work on their new book, 'On the Road' by Susan Steggall. We have discussed using prepositions to describe a journey and they have made their own glossary of prepositions. They enjoyed working with Reception to learn the story using a story map, and have looked closely at the pictures in the book to see what is going on and what they could infer from them.

In Maths, Year 1 have been exploring addition and subtraction fact families using counters, ten frames and part whole models. They have also been comparing addition and subtraction calculations using inequality symbols. Year 2 have been looking at odd and even numbers and what happens if we add two odd numbers, or an odd and an even number. They have also been learning to divide by 5 and 10 using practical resources, recognising that using their 5 and 10 times tables can help them.

In Geography they have learnt the points of a compass and how it can help find the way on a map,. They evaluated their collage pictures in art, choosing their favourite, and suggested improvements which could be made.

In Science, they have used their knowledge of microhabitats and mini-beasts to design their own room for a bug hotel.

The sound of recorders playing is improving as the children learn to cover the hole correctly when playing their notes.

In ICT we had fun making digital music to represent their chosen animal.

The children are still excited to get Dojo points every day if they have read at home.

A fantastic week Class 1.

## THE LEARNING ZONE





This week, in English, the children have been continuing their sequence of learning based on *The Firebird* by *Saviour Pirotta*. They have been thinking about the repeated patterns in the text, adverbials of time, how to use pronouns and synonyms to improve cohesion and how to develop their techniques of building tension and suspense in their writing.

In Maths, Years 3 and 4 have been concentrating on finding perimeters of rectilinear shapes and Years 5 and 6 have been multiplying and dividing decimals by integers, solving problems using these calculations as well as starting a unit of work on percentages.

Other activities have included discussing how to be safe around electricity, making a river of their own, finding the path of the River Mole, learning to play another note on a Ukulele and starting to make their designs for their sculptures in Art.

Well done Class 2 and I hope you all have a great weekend.

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
