This week we have had a dinotastic time! The children have fully embraced our dinosaur theme. ## THE LEARNING ZONE





#### Class 1 - Mrs Godly

This week, Reception have been learning about the different seasons. They have been finding out about how trees change during the year, using the book *Tree- A peek through picture book* by Britta Teckentrup and discussed the different types of weather we see in each season. They have all enjoyed finding out about this subject and any discussions you have at home about seasons and the weather will help to embed their learning further. In Maths, they have been looking at the composition of the number 5 by using a variety of different Maths equipment to investigate ways the number 5 can be made.

In English, Year 1 and 2 have continued their work on traditional tales. They have used Little Red Riding Hood to write their own commands, exclamatory sentences, interesting verbs and have been changing these verbs into the past or present tense. In Maths, Year 1 have been learning how to subtract without crossing 10, using tens frames, counters and number lines. Year 2 have been learning about doubling, as well as learning the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Any practise they can do at home with learning these times tables would be beneficial. Other lessons have included investigating the school grounds to find minibeast habitats, looking at the collage work of Henri Matisse and starting to learn to play a recorder.

Well done, Class 1, have a good weekend.

#### Class 2 - Mr Saltearn

Another action packed week, this week in Class 2.

This week saw us start our wildlife trust project of improving the school grounds. The children have control over this project and selected it out of five options. As a class we decided to clear the top garden pots and tyres in order to plant some fruit and vegetables that the children would like to sell or use in their cooking. All the children worked incredibly hard on Wednesday and did a fantastic job clearing the top garden and starting on the playground. The children are now going to decide as a council what they would like to plant and when it needs to be planted by.

In Maths, Years 5 and 6 finished their sequence on fractions and have started their new sequence on decimals and percentages. We have been learning how to change a fraction into a decimal number. In Years 3 and 4 the children have started their new sequence on length and perimeter and have started to convert different lengths of measure.

In English, we have been busy planning our fact pages on a magical object from Harry Potter and have been discussing how we can set up our pages and the information that we will need. The children have been learning about editing and worked as the teacher to mark and edit a piece of work that I wrote for them.

In Science, Years 5 and 6 used a pencil to create their own dimmer switches and then explained why the bulb got brighter as the clips became closer together.

Today 8 children from Class 2 will travel over to Winkleigh to play in a mini netball festival, we look forward to seeing and hearing how they got on next week.

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.

It takes less than a minute to apply.
