


A note from the Head

Class 1 - Mrs Betts

This week in our Curious Quest, the Faithful Friends have asked KS1 to find out about non-fiction books, while reception have been asked to create stories involving their own baddy witch. ***They have designed homes and been shopping at the market to buy carrots and rockets but where will they travel?***

In maths, the children have been investigating matching pairs this was based on the story of 'Simon Sock' by Sue Hendra. They have also been counting dominoes, and matching them with the correct numerals. KS1 have been learning about subtracting and adding two 2-digit numbers.

We had a fantastic trip to 'Clip and Climb' on Thursday. It was great to see how some of the children who found climbing difficult on previous trips were able to overcome their fears and really embrace the challenge.

In foundation subjects, we have been learning how to kick a football with accuracy and control, learnt about how exercise affects our bodies and why it is important for our health and investigated aerial view photographs by identifying geographical features within them.

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
