Class 1 – Mrs Betts

We have started a brand-new English sequence this week in Class One, all about Dear Mother Goose. The children have been predicting what the story will be about and the characters who will feature all from the clues on the front cover including the title. In maths, they have been comparing number and calculations using mathematical symbols and the language of greater than, less than and equals to.

As well as, working out missing number problems and learning how the inverse operation can be useful. Reception have been basing their drawing and coding this week on the legendary cartoon series 'Batfink'. They have invented a character, costume and a secret lair. In maths, they have been learning all about the number 9. In geography, the children learnt about the Union Jack flag and how it is constructed. I wonder which flag of the United Kingdom does not appear in the Union Jack! In RE, the children were learning about the 'Good News that Jesus brings to Christians'. The children discussed peace with no fighting, forgiveness and letting go of anger, and friendship giving up your time for people.

In art, the children are working hard on their final piece for their Kandinsky inspired art. This will be on display in the church as part of the school art exhibition. The children had a great day at Winkleigh catching up with their friends and thoroughly enjoyed working with the artist EmmyLou again.

Class 2 – Mrs Miali

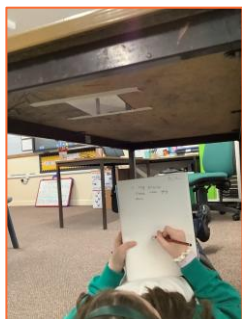
This week has been brimming with creativity and excitement.

We have been delving deep into descriptive writing for English and really looking at the vocabulary we use to make a reader understand how characters are feeling. We have used a wide range of emotive and persuasive language to write positive and negative food reviews, as well as trying to persuade people to visit somewhere that might not be the most desirable location!

Their understanding of lengths and measures is developing well in maths and they even had the opportunity to use their measuring skills in guided reading, to see how big Crusoe is going to grow: Too big for our classroom! The children also experienced some ancient Mayan maths in history. When looking at the glyphs that had been carved into some of the ruins, the class learned about their symbols for numbers and completed some calculations using only the symbols – no numbers.

The excitement for swimming was finally met on Wednesday, with the class attending their first PE swimming lesson. The pool was lovely and warm for them and they were fantastic at trying everything. It was brilliant to see the confidence in them all and especially how much it has grown since last year.

The children also had a fantastic art experience at Winkleigh, meeting artist Emmy Lou and creating some beautiful, creative pieces. They are very excited for you to see them all, alongside their self-portraits they have been working hard on in this term's art sequence.
