Dear Parents / Carers

It is lovely to see the new netball hoops being used, thank you to Mrs Miali for putting them up.

Mrs Moyies has sent out a questionnaire to see if parents want an afterschool club and what they would like. Please respond to the questionnaire as our wonderful Friends of Kings Nympton School have offered to fund an after school club, for which we are very grateful. Thank you.

ATTENDANCE

Devon County Council has issued all maintained schools with a new attendance policy this term. Attendance is a very high priority nationally and it is important that children attend school regularly. The new policy can be found on the website. There are some key changes that I would like to make you aware of:-

- Children will be given a late mark if they arrive at school after 9:00am
- Children arriving after 9:15am when the register has closed will be given an unauthorised mark for the morning session
- All holiday requests totalling 10 sessions or more (5 days) have to be reported to Devon County Council and a fixed penalty notice will be issued by the local authority. This is £60 per parent, per child.
- Parents of children whose attendance drops below 93% will be invited in for a meeting and an attendance support plan will be drawn up
- As a Federation we will only be allowing children whose attendance is consistent and above 93% to attend in-school extra-curricular activities, such as sporting events and festivals. This is due to the fact that the learning missed will need to be caught up

These changes have to be enforced by schools to comply with Devon County Council's Code of Conduct.

- Keep registers in line with Statutory and Safeguarding requirements.

- Inform Admin of any attendance concerns.
- Headteacher to liaise with families in addressing barriers to attendance.
- Be aware of vulnerable students.

- Ensure Escalation Process consistently followed with discretion when appropriate.
- Responsible for School Attendance Data and meeting Attendance Targets.
- To monitor and support attendance of Vulnerable Students.

- Headteacher to request letter 2 to be sent (arrange meeting with parents/carers)
- Headteacher to complete action plan/ discuss with family and agree review date.

Following review date and continuing attendance concerns

- Headteachr4e request letter 3
- Headteacher to refer to EWO

EWO to consider:

- · General attendance meeting
- Legal meeting

Possible legal action

- Penalty notice
- Court proceedings

If a child has 10 sessions or more, unauthorised absences, for example a holiday- Letter 4. Further absences will result in letter 5 and possible penalty notice.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 1

Even though the weather has not been too great this week, we have been working hard in the classroom and it is a real pleasure to see our class numbers grow! Reception have been learning to say, read and write the next few phonemes they must learn. They have listened and discussed the story of Dogger, described their favourite toys and have been talking and thinking about what makes them special. In maths activities, they have been finding pairs of objects and looking at matching things.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have been acting out the story of Oi Frog!, thinking about how the characters might be feeling, writing short letters to the cat and even researching and writing information pages about frogs. In Maths, Year 1 have been comparing numbers using inequality signs and Year 2 have been ordering numbers to one hundred and counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s. Other lessons have included finding out about seasons, sketching a tiger in the style of Henri Rousseau's painting- Tiger in a Tropical Storm and testing materials to see which would be the best to mend my umbrella with.

Last week we had our first Forest School day. Everyone loved it and I know we have been looking forward to today's Forest School.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 2

Another busy week in Class 2!

This week we have welcomed Euan into Class and the children have been extremely welcoming.

In English this week we have continued our book Mechanimals and the children have designed and labelled their own Mechaniamal that they will use to create their own story next week. Year 5 and 6 have been learning about using brackets for parenthesis, while Year 3 and 4 have been learning about prepositions and used images from the book to write sentences about where the animal had been placed outside using a prepositions.

In Maths, this week Year 5 and 6 have concluded their sequence on Place value and have started to learn about the four operations. The children have been working hard this week, with some challenging questions. Year 3 and 4 have been using Place value counters to create numbers and find 1, 10, 100 and 1000 more or less. I accidentally dropped all the counters and the children had to find the correct value counters to build their number. Its safe to say that they enjoyed spilling the counters more than picking them up.

In Science Year 5 and 6 created their own parachute to bring their egg to the ground safely. The children evaluated their parachutes and wrote a conclusion to why it worked or didn't work. Year 3 and 4 have been testing different materials to see if they are magnetic or not.

We have managed to avoid the rain this week, please remember to bring a coat, the Devon weather can change very quickly.

Have a great weekend, Class 2.



child off school?



Until...

at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
48 hours after their last episode	
they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
4 days after the rash first appeared	
5 days after the swelling started	
they've had their first treatment	
24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
