Useful Information:

Naming Clothing, Bags and Lunchboxes.

The end of the day can be tricky for little ones. Can we please ask you to clearly name coats/sweatshirts/bags and lunch boxes. By managing their own belongings, it will encourage the children to become more independent.

Toileting

Please keep us up to date with any toileting needs. If your child needs to use nappies and wipes these need to be sent in from home and make sure you include nappy bags.

Clothing

We don't recommend that children wear their best outfits as we encourage them to spend time exploring the different activities on offer and these can often include using resources that can be a bit messy!

Suitable footwear is a must! Trainers or shoes that the children can move freely in.

Snack

Fruit is provided for both morning and afternoon snack. The children have a choice of milk or water. We promote independence by encouraging the children to pour their own drinks and peel their own fruit. If you would also like to provide a water bottle for use throughout the day, please name it and we will keep it in the snack area where it will be accessible throughout the day. If you do wish to provide a water bottle, please ensure it contains only water.

Development scrap books and assessments

Nursery staff will gather observational evidence to assess your child's development under the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. We will regularly share information with you about your child's learning and development during open mornings and parents evenings. At the end of their time with us your child will be given their 'This is me' book containing photographs, artwork etc. as a memento of their nursery journey.

Safeguarding is of paramount importance. Our designated safeguarding lead is Mrs V Fenemore, deputies are Mr W Slocombe and Mrs D Rowcliffe in the event that you have any concerns please contact them through admin@winkleigh.devon.sch.uk/ admin@kingsnympton.devon.sch.uk.
