

# Spanish—Giving directions

## Civilisation

### Prior Knowledge

**Year 3:** You learnt to listen to and repeat familiar Spanish words and short phrases, including classroom instructions and basic greetings, with accurate pronunciation.

**Year 4:** You learnt to ask and answer simple questions, recognise and use singular nouns with articles (el / la), and understand simple commands through actions.

### My Composite Knowledge:

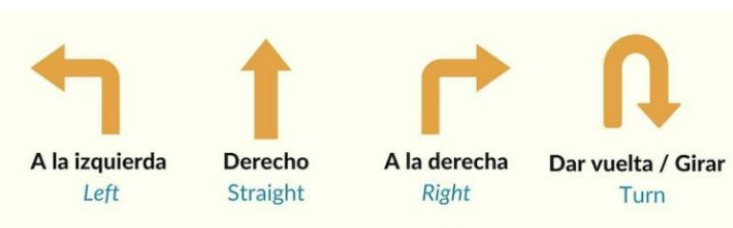
