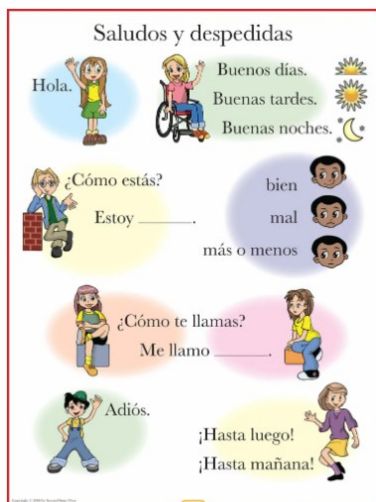
Prior Knowledge

Year 3: Colours, numbers, greetings, classroom instructions, names of fruit, days of the week, months of the year, Christmas in Spain.

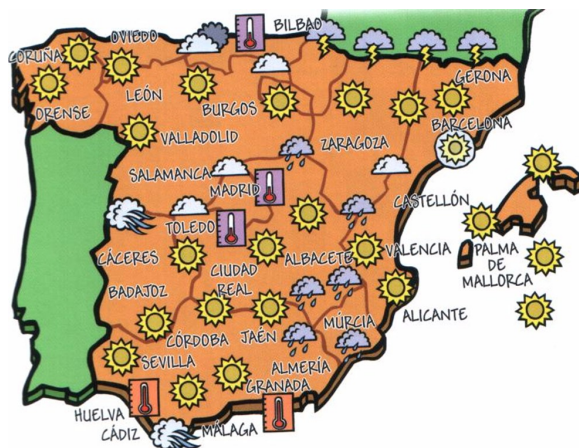
Year 4: Simple negative form (no tengo), family members
