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A note from the Head

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to those parents of Year 2 and 3 children who joined us this week for our 'tour of the school' to find out more about our curriculum and the children's learning journey. We have had some lovely feedback from all the sessions so far and are pleased you have found them useful. Tours for Year 4 and Year 5 parents will be on Wednesday and Thursday next week.

I had a wonderful day with our Year 3 children in Exeter yesterday; visiting the museum (RAMM) and Exeter Cathedral. As always the children were impeccably behaved and it was a real pleasure to share the experience with them. Thank you to Mr Slocombe for organising this trip. I think the highlight for many was the train ride, even if they did keep asking "are we there yet?"!

Our school councillors are wearing their new badges with pride, and they look very smart. Mr Davis will be recruiting some Year 6 children to become librarians so we can get the whole school library back up and running next week.

It is good to see school getting back to some sort of normality, however we are still being cautious and as always adhering to Government Guidelines and Policies. We are aware that the Crediton area currently has a high number of cases hence the continued need for caution. Currently, if a child displays symptoms the guidance is that they are required to get a PCR test. If a child tests positive on an LFD test, they do not need to get a PCR test but isolate for 5 days. On the 5th and 6th day, LFD tests should be taken and if both results are negative, they are able to return to school. If not, they must continue to isolate until they receive two negative LFD results, 24 hours apart. Please remember that LFD tests should only be used when there are no symptoms, PCR tests should be arranged when symptoms are displayed.

Thank you once again to the whole staff team who are maintaining as close to normal running of the school despite continuing to be impacted by staff absences.

There is a very large pile of lost property outside the main school reception. If you are missing items of school uniform, please have a look through it. We will be disposing of anything that's left after the end of next week.

NEWS FROM THE NURSERY











This week we have been learning about the history of pirating. During circle time discussions we talked about how pirates 'construct' a gang and sail across the sea in their 'galleons' looking for other ships to attack and steal 'cargo' and, if they were lucky, treasure from. We learnt the funny names of some famous pirates from long ago including Blackbeard and Calico Jack and, contrary to common misconception, discovered there were many fierce female pirates too. We played a game to make up our own dastardly pirate names and laughed as we became a pirate gang with names such as Captain Henry Sparrow and Buccaneer Esther Hornswoggle!! We made pirate hats and used our cutting skills to decorate them with collage materials, adding a skull and cross bones. We loved turning ourselves into pirates and wearing eye patches which we learnt pirates wore as they believed it would make each eye stronger, enabling them to see better in the dark. Our outside space has been transformed into an underwater adventure park with hanging fishing nets, numbered fish and our own pirate ship to sail the seven seas in. 'Shiver me timbers me hearties'!!

Throughout the week we have been using directional language and following instructions. During Write Dance we continued to dance to Following the Leader from the Disney version of the Peter Pan film, using scarves and then practiced our balancing skills by 'walking the plank'. We listened carefully to instructions to

follow directions as walked down to the school hall and then later used these directions to make treasure maps, hunting for hidden golden coins in our top garden. We have had a very busy pirating week!

To keep you updated on the status of the building, we have had visits from the Loss Adjuster and are expecting another report today with regard to the validity of re-entering the play room. It is taking longer than we hoped as they are investigating how much water damage has occurred under the flooring. Hopefully we will have further news to share next week. We are keeping our fingers crossed that we will be able to re-enter the building, with the work being carried out in stages and the floor being replaced during school holidays. Thank you all so much for your patience, kindness and understanding. The children have been amazing, as always in adapting to the change in their circumstances and a huge thankyou goes out to all of our wonderful Nursery Team who continue to make the children's learning fun and inspiring despite the adversities!

Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

In Owls Class this week the children have thoroughly enjoyed investigating measures. They have practised using balance scales to investigate 'heavy' and 'light' and particularly enjoyed using the scales to weigh out and measure ingredients for their afternoon snack on Thursday!

In P.E, they have continued working on their throwing and catching skills and have begun thinking about how they can work together as a team, enjoying playing lots of great new games with our new P.E coach Mr Griffiths. *Please can we remind parents that children need to come to school wearing suitable PE clothes including trainers on a Tuesday and a Thursday*.

Part of the children's writing task this week has been to compose a sentence linked to our class text 'Rosie's Hat.' The children used some 'tricky words' to write their sentences and thought about where Rosie's hat might blow to next. Some hats travelled as far as New Zealand!

As part of our Knowledge and Understanding of The World, we talked about and watched some weather reports. The children loved using the whiteboard to make their own weather maps with Miss Garnsworthy. They have worked so hard on their phonics and reading skills again this week, and our 3x per week guided reading sessions are really helping the children to think about the process of sounding out and decoding, using expression and prosody and also developing their comprehension and understanding of texts. We thank you for your continued support with hearing your child read at home.

Year 1—Mrs Betts & Mrs Rowcliffe









This week in Year 1 we have finished our teaching sequence on Three Billy Goats Gruff. We have written our own innovated story with a different group of animals but kept the troll under the bridge.

We have also finished our sequence on numbers within 20. We will move to higher numbers next week, up to 50.

We are speeding through the new phonic scheme and getting very good at blending the sounds we are learning. We also are very good at spotting the phonemes and digraphs in sentences, a key skill to reading fluency. The guided reading books are linked to the phonic stage children are at, so we hope to be sending home individual reading books next week linked to the sounds in the guided reading sessions.

Bug club has been set up with books linked to the children's previous assessment. If you want to use it and are struggling, please send in an email to admin and we can help to get your child logged on.

We continue, in Science, to learn about different vertebrates and can't wait to go to the zoo to see them.

In Art this week we are making Kandinsky woven trolls, we hope to post some pictures on Facebook!

Year 2—Miss Jones



Another week of hard work! I have been particularly impressed with the children's learning in Maths. This week we have been looking at multiplication and division. We explored different vocabulary relating to multiplication such as lots of, groups of, multiply and product. The children did well at applying this language in written and spoken contexts.

In English we have begun our shared write by recapping the structure of our key text and applying our grammatical knowledge. In Science this week we learned about manmade and natural materials. In Geography we worked collaboratively to identify examples of physical and human



features on a map by exploring OS symbols.



In Art we learned about a

composition and had a go at one of our own with a range of different materials. We made two different compositions ready to evaluate next week.

I've given out a record number of reading stickers this week, well done everyone!






SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Year 5—Mr Walter

This week in English we have been reading, analysing and writing short stories focussing on the use of perfect form. This has enabled us to show if our sentences are written in the past, present or future. Next week, we will be writing our own short stories to engage the reader and leave them wanting more.



In Maths, we have worked on converting between improper and mixed number fractions using concrete and verbal resources to help develop our understanding. Additionally, we have been looking and extending sequences of fractions following a given rule.



In Art, there are fantastic examples of landscapes focussing on a scene of our choice, we were able to apply our learning of texture and tone to impact our end piece.

In Geography, we have been busy researching the different features of a river, deepening our understanding of the waters journey from its source. We then plotted some of Devon's rivers on a map to highlight our local locations. Similarly in Science, we all selected a mammal and a bird to compare their life cycles. We were using our understanding of the different categories to explain the differences in gestation and incubation.

Great work this week Year 5, have a great weekend!

Year 6—Mr Davis



Dear all, we have had another busy week in Year 6. In English, we have moved onto how authors write dialogue and what techniques they use. Year 6 have been practicing using possessive and contractive apostrophes, different sentence types and how they can punctuate their sentences to add emotion.

In Maths, we have started our new teaching sequence around decimals and percentages. The children have been practising multiplying and dividing numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 using manipulative sand diagrams to support them.

In RE this week, Year 6 have been performing and comparing creation stories from different religions.

In Science, Year 6 have been learning about the Linnaean Classification system and have had to find and classify animals from different kingdoms.

Finally, in Geography, the children have moved from looking at South America as a continent to looking at the countries more closely. They have been comparing climate, landscape, rainfall and population.
