This week our Maths focus has been adding together two sets of numbers. The children have loved playing a range of dice games and are using their maths vocabulary well to describe and explain what they can see. ***I wonder if you can play some maths games over half term involving dice. Can you tell what number you have rolled without having to count the spots? Can you play a game where you have to roll two dice and add the numbers together?***

In phonics the children have looked at double letters and have become detectives looking for digraphs and trigraphs within words. ***Can you be sound detectives over half term Owls?***

As part of our PSED work, the children learnt about ways to stay safe online with the help of a number of familiar characters from some of our favourite fairy tales!

In P.E they had a lovely time dancing to Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Suite, inspired by a book we have in class.

Year 1—Mrs Betts & Mrs Rowcliffe

Happy Friday everyone! I hope that you are not too disappointed to get an unexpected day off.

Year 1's have worked hard this week. In English, they have been writing some lovely letters to and from Mother Goose based upon the book Dear Mother Goose by Michael Rosen.

In Maths, the children have been looking at counting in 2s and 5s using a number track. They had to find the missing numbers to complete their track going both forwards (greater than) and backwards (less than).

Music this week introduced the children to the funk style of music, and although, some children said they were not keen, they still managed a little dance to Tower of Power 'Diggin on James Brown'. I think they all secretly loved it!

We would like to take this opportunity of congratulating the children on the progress they have made over this half term. They have all worked incredibly hard and their progress demonstrates this. We are very proud of their mature attitudes towards their learning and cannot wait for them to return to school, so that we can continue to support them. We hope you have a fabulous break.

Year 2—Miss Jones

We have come to the end of the half term and it really has flown by.

In English we have started our new sequence of learning called this is how we do it. We read the books and responded to it with likes, dislikes, patterns and puzzles. We then looked at some new vocabulary from the text and exemplified it. In maths we have been exploring statistics.

We have created our own tally charts and pictograms by collecting data in class. We used our knowledge of counting in 2, 5 and 10 to interpret data.

We finished our Science unit on materials and used our knowledge to design a water bottle, thinking about the appropriate materials and their properties.

We also created our own maps and included a compass and relevant key.

In Art we evaluated our collages and were all really proud of the outcomes. It's been lovely to hear the children share their home learning in class.

In Geography this week, we made a list of all the natural resources that we considered essential for survival. We explained the uses of each resource and where they come from.

Year 5—Mr Walter

We have reached the end of another term and this week Year 5 have been working hard as ever. In English we have been using modal verbs and adverbs of possibility to indicate the certainty of certain events happening from our focus text of Tuesday by David Wiesner. This sequence will carry on for the first week after half term.


Maths this week has seen us use various concrete and pictorial methods to show how to manipulate mixed number fractions by adding and subtracting. We have applied the need to ensure we have followed each step to find our answer.

Mrs Gent and I were so impressed with the artwork in the style of African artist TingaTinga, we added colour to our landscape to create a clear foreground and background while incorporating a silhouette. I look forward to seeing these on display next term.

On Wednesday, the class turned into a clay mess! In groups we had the challenge to make the foundations of a river and identify the key features. We then poured water onto our design to see if our river would form and flow.

Finally, we all really enjoyed Team Rubicon attending and teaching us once more about skateboarding. It was fantastic to see everyone giving it a go and supporting each other.

Year 6—Mr Davis

Although the half term has been cut a day short, Year 6 have ended it brilliantly. They really enjoyed their skateboarding session with Ryan from Team Rubicon. They practised some new tricks and I was proud to have the coach come and complement the class on their behaviour during the session.

In English, we have practised using pronouns, determiners and subordinating conjunctions to improve the cohesion of their writing. They have then applied these skills, as well as the other grammatical techniques we have revised, to an extended piece of writing. The children were tasked with rewriting a section of Harry Potter from a different character's point of view.

In Maths, we finished our teaching sequence on fractions, decimals and percentages. Year 6 have been using the inverse operation to find missing percentages and working backwards through problems where they have a specific percentage and have to calculate the whole.

In Science this week, Year 6 have learnt about arthropods and looked at the specific features of this phylum. We also discussed the common misconception that insects are actually arthropods.

Finally, in RE, we have considered Scientific Creation Theory and what the similarities and differences are between this creation theory and the Judeo-Christian story.

I really hope you all have a great break and look forward to seeing you after half term.

COMMUNITY NEWS



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Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
