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A note from the Head

Dear Parents / Carers,

I would like to say a huge thank you to Mr Marsh for helping us put the condemned bench in a safe place, and then removing it off our site. It is very much appreciated. Thank you.

As I mentioned last week, Mr Chaplin our Educational Consultant came to visit the school last Friday. Below are some comments from his report:

Quality of education

Leaders have sustained very high expectations for the quality of the learning environment. These are communicated effectively and, as a result, a high-quality learning environment is consistent across the federation. The sequence of learning in subjects is clear and very well-presented. A range of subjects is evident through displays and pupils' work.

Staff are very positive and contribute successfully to a calm, purposeful culture focused on learning. Consequently, relationships with pupils are good; this supports strong, positive attitudes to learning. The impact on outcomes is a strength, as shown by results in national assessments and pupils' ongoing work.

Early this term, explicit teaching of the protected characteristics took place. A discussion with a Year 6 pupil demonstrated the effectiveness of this teaching on personal development and knowledge. For example, the pupil had studied aspects of racism from the 1960's and understood issues of equality and fairness. He applied this knowledge to a recent event reported in the media and identified appropriate and inappropriate behaviours.

In writing, the amount of work completed by pupils since the beginning of term is good. The federation's curriculum is being implemented with a good pitch of work; standards are therefore good for the beginning of the academic year. Learning in writing is used to teach content across other subjects. Younger pupils, for example, have used a text as the starting point to then learn knowledge about frogs.

Teachers have very clear expectations of pupils. Consequently, work is well presented and expectations of how to set out work are established. Feedback systems are manageable for teachers and their workload. A policy of emphasising feedback at the point of learning with some recorded marking is in place.

Well done to all the staff who make Kings Nympton such a wonderful school, thank you!

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 1—Mrs Godly

This week, Reception have been continuing to learn some new phonemes and how to write them. They have also been reading and thinking about the story, *Have You Filled A Bucket Today?* by *Carol McCloud.* This is a lovely book, encouraging children to do nice things for other people. In Maths activities, they have been using mathematical language to compare different amounts of things.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have started a sequence of writing using the book *Naughty Bus* by *Jan and Jerry Oke*. This book uses photographs to tell the story of a toy London bus and a child. The class have been studying the pictures of what the bus does, thinking about how the bus might be feeling, sequencing the story events and taking close-up and long-distance photographs like those in the book.

For our Maths lessons, Year 1 have been learning addition facts, making fact families and recapping their knowledge of number bonds to 10. Year 2 have been using their knowledge of number bonds to 10 to find number bonds to 100 as well as adding and subtracting one and ten to numbers within one hundred, using a hundred square to help them. Other lessons have included testing the absorbency of different kitchen paper and disposable cloths, finding out about extreme weather such as hurricanes, using different art mediums to draw and colour big leaves and learning about the Shabbat in Judaism.

Another great week, well done Class 1!

NB- Please could you make sure your child wears socks on Tuesday when we go to Bear Town, as they will not be allowed to wear shoes inside the building, thank you.

Class 2—Mr Saltearn

A Busy week in Class 2!

This week in English we have been learning about features of non- chronological reports and we created our own checklists and searched examples for them. We annotated examples in our books.

This week Year 5 and 6 learnt about gears and how they work, we labelled different diagrams of gears and what terrain that they would be suited to.

In Geography Year 5 and 6 discussed reasons why people might migrate, we discussed both forced and voluntary migration.

Year 3 and 4 discussed positive and negatives of migration on people and places and as a group created a list of these.

On Wednesday all the children took part in a virtual experience on Charles Darwin run by Plymouth Aquarium, the children enjoyed the activities and learning about Charles Darwin and Evolution.

As a class we started our inter house sports this week and the children had the chance to practice their skills from their PE lessons on football.

The children are very excited about forest school this week and we will keep you updated with what they get up to.

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
