


Art- Painting including drawing

Prior Knowledge

Previously, the children have used a variety of mediums and tools to paint, draw, sew, weave, print and create sculptures. They have drawn and painted a portrait of Queen Elizabeth II for her Diamond Jubilee celebrations. They have also completed a unit of work based on painting and drawing Henri Rousseau's Tiger in a Storm.




Key Vocabulary
