

RE- How is Easter celebrated around the world?

Environment

Prior Knowledge:

Children will know the Easter story. They will have covered *Why does Easter Matter to Christians?* in RE last year. Easter celebrations and the Easter story is also included in Reception planning. They will have studied what Christmas means to Christians, as well as what the 'good news' Jesus brings to Christians is.



My Component Knowledge:

Lesson 1: What do you know about Easter?

Lesson 2: I can give examples of ways in which Christians use the story of Easter to guide their beliefs and actions.

Lesson 3: I know that many different people celebrate Easter and that Easter traditions vary around the world.

Lesson 4: I can find out how people from other countries celebrate Easter.

Lesson 5: I can understand that Easter is also a celebration of new life and Spring.

Lesson 6: I can recognise that all Easter celebrations are not religious based.

My Composite Knowledge:

I can appreciate and recognise ways in which people celebrate Easter around the world and that these traditions vary.

My Powerful Knowledge:

I can think, talk and ask questions about whether the story of Easter only has something to say to Christians. I am making connections between traditions, religious and non-religious beliefs, concepts, practices and ideas in the wider world. I am building the knowledge, understanding and skills needed to handle questions about religious belief, reflecting on my own ideas and ways of living.
