SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 1

We have started this half term with enthusiasm and great efforts in all activities!

Reception have been concluding their topic on Healthy Living by learning about other ways we can be healthy and have made a healthy lifestyle wheel to record all the ways they know. They have also been finding out about the Hindu Raksha Bandhan ceremony, which celebrates the special bond between brothers and sisters. They enjoyed making their own friendship bracelets for each other to show they all have a special bond too. They have also been finding out about and investigating doubling in Maths and enjoyed using paint and small world characters to practise this.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have started a unit of work on a non-fiction book called *Hidden World: Ocean* by *Libby Walden*. They have enjoyed learning new facts about different sea creatures and discussing new vocabulary in the text. In Maths, Year 1 have completed their work on multiplication and division. They have been learning how to make equal groups by grouping and sharing. Year 2 have started a unit of work on length and height. They have been drawing and measuring lengths in centimetres, measuring using metre sticks and comparing lengths using equal to, greater and less than symbols.

In other lessons, the children have been finding out about Mother Teresa, planning a route from Kings Nympton to Bude and answering the question: What makes a good pet and how do we look after it?

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 2



It has been great to welcome the children back for our last half term of the year. It has been fantastic to see their excitement and enthusiasm for the new half term. If you haven't done so already, please head to our <u>class page</u> on the website for an overview of our learning this half term. Please note that our PSHE topic this half term is *Growing and Changing* and all year groups will be learning about puberty, so the children may ask questions on this subject at home.

It has been a busy week in Class 2. On Monday, we walked to the village hall in preparation to write our recounts on Thursday. The children worked in small groups to think about what they heard, saw, and smelt on their journey and to verbally recount their journey to the class. As a class, the children offered feedback to the different groups to improve their recounts.

In Maths this week, Years 5 and 6 have continued with their sequence and have been learning about angles on a straight line, around a point and vertically opposite angles. The children have been using their knowledge of these to calculate missing angles. In Year 3 and 4, the children have completed their sequence on statistics and have started their new sequence on properties of shapes.

Before half term we introduced *Times Tables Rockstar* to the children and it has been great to hear the children get excited about practising their times tables and challenging each other to improve. This has had a positive

impact on their times tables and Around the World challenge that the children complete each week. Keep up the hard work and maybe challenge parents to a game!

This week, Year 3 and 4 travelled to Exeter on the train to Haven Banks to try bell-boating. The children had a fantastic day and really enjoyed the experience, some getting wetter than others! Thanks to our parents and

carers for dropping and collecting the children to and from the train station.

LITTLE WOODLANDS SUMMER HALF TERM 2 LEARNING





Welcome back! We hope you had a fantastic half-term holiday. The children have been telling us how they celebrated the Platinum Jubilee with family and friends. Lots of fun was had by all and lots of cake eaten it seems!

This half-term we welcome Roman to Preschool. We are sure he will settle in quickly and soon become a huge part of our setting.

As ever, the first newsletter of the half-term is a little different to the weekly edition as we share our learning overview with you all. Our topic for this final half term of the academic year is *Marvellous Machines*. We will be focusing on the concept of 'Innovation' and we will look at how machines have been developed to allow us to conquer all aspects of life, from farming and construction to exploration under the sea and venturing off to far off lands, even outer space!

We have our family trip booked for the 6th July. We are very much looking forward to you joining us for a fun filled day at The Big Sheep in Bideford.

Under the Early Years Foundation Stage, the seven areas of learning and development will be covered as follows:

Personal Social and Emotional Development

Talk about what we want in the future, our dreams. What do we look forward to, what are we proud of? Have confidence in own abilities and learn to manage setbacks and disappointments. Learn to take responsibility to look after ourselves, including managing personal needs independently and managing our own risks.

Communication and Language

Enjoy listening to longer stories and can remember much of what happens. Sequence stories and lists in the correct order (Whatever Next by Jill Murphy, Aliens Love Underpants, Marvelous Machines) Listen with increased attention to sounds, using Little Wandle phonics programme.

Show interest in recognising familiar words including writing our own name.

Begin to formulate graphemes in a related context

Introduce a range of vocabulary and begin to use vocabulary in everyday conversation.

Can start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns.

SUMMER HALF-TERM 2 LEARNING

Literacy

Listen and respond to a range of books and stories-fiction and non-fiction

Begin to recognise initial letter sounds, blend and segment words and recognise familiar words, using some of our print knowledge in writing.

Talk about a variety of subjects using new vocabulary

Physical Development

Start taking part in some group activities which they make up for themselves, or in teams, collaborating with others. Play on different types of play equipment - having a go and taking a risk.

Be increasingly independent as they get dressed/undressed

Show preference for a dominant hand and continue to develop fine motor control.

Expressive Art and Design

Choose the right resources to carry out their own plan.

Use your imagination to engage in role play activities.

Use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making snips in paper with scissors

Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils Explore colour and colour mixing

Create closed shapes with continuous lines and begin to use these shapes to represent objects

Draw with increasing complexity and detail

Remember and sing entire songs

Respond to what they have heard, expressing their thoughts and feelings

Experiment with sounds

Understanding the world

DT – Explore how things work.

Make imaginative and complex small worlds with blocks and construction kits.

Explore different materials freely, in order to develop their ideas about how to use them and what to make.

Science – Talk about and recognise the planet in the solar system. Talk about the phase of the moon. How do we travel to Space?

How do machines make our lives easier? Explore machines used in farming, construction, under the sea, emergency vehicles

Maths - Number

Recite numbers past 5, sequence numbers in order to 10. Count backwards from 5 to 0. Fast recognition of up to 3 objects (subertising) Show 'finger numbers' up to 5. Solve real world mathematical problems.

Sequence and recognise patterns.

Shape & Space

Make comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity.

Begin to describe a sequence of events, real or fictional, using words, such as 'first', 'then...'

Development scrap books and assessments

Your child's key person (Tammie takes on this role in our setting) will gather observational evidence to assess your child's development under the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. You will receive two reports with regard to your child's progress and we will update you on their next steps during termly parent's evenings via Zoom. At the end of their time with us you will be given a scrap book containing photographs, art work etc. as a memento of their nursery journey.

Reports will be issued towards the end of term.

Sun-cream/Sun hats/Summer clothing

Fingers crossed as the term progresses the weather will become warmer. We will shortly be sending out permission slips for you to authorise re-application of sun cream. Could we ask you to put sun cream on your child in the morning and we will re-apply at lunch time? Please ensure their bottle of sun cream is left in their bags and named.
