SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 1

We have had a fun week in Class 1. It was great to have two transition days, when the children starting Reception in September came to join us. We based our activities on *The Scarecrow's Wedding* by Julia Donaldson and all the children really enjoyed themselves. We made our own version of the scarecrows in the story, made wedding cakes, learnt a scarecrow song and danced to The Wedding March by Felix Mendelssohn. We are looking forward to the Preschool children joining us very soon! Thank you to Mr Blackie for providing the hay!

As well as all this, Reception have been continuing to find out about people who are important to our wider community and thinking about what they would like to be when they are older. In Maths activities, they have been developing their spatial reasoning by describing the position of objects and using shapes to make pictures and other shapes. In English lessons, Years 1 and 2 have been planning their 'Thank You' stories. In Maths, Year 1 have been working with money. They have been recognising coins and notes, counting coins and making an amount of money in different ways. Year 2 have been developing their problem skills by completing investigations involving addition and subtraction, place value and money. In other lessons, the children have made and tested sundials, found out about wedding and baptism ceremonies and discovered how shopping for food has changed over the past 100 years.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS



AUTUMN HALF TERM 1

Autumn half term 1 clubs will start w/c 12th September. Please note that club bookings are non-refundable. Clubs are open to all children from Reception to Year 6.

Mondays 1530-1630: Pick 'n' Mix Club with Mrs Miali Minimum of 7 children required £3 per session, £18 for the block

Opportunity to experience lots of different activities week on week—craft, cooking, sport, gardening, dance, games - you name it, we'll try it! The children will help determine the options on offer.

Children are taught the basics of coding and programming through making and programming robots using an educational version of Minecraft which helps children to learn how to start with code in an easy to understand and engaging format. Starting with instructions, children learn to make functioning guitars, a cat, vehicles and more. Following on from this, the children go on to make games through different software, exploring their imagination and learning a coding language called Python. Sessions are offered on Stop Motion Animation, Lego Robots, Minecraft Coding, Kodu game design and more!

Wednesdays 1530-1630: Sports Club with Saints South West Minimum of 10 children required Free of charge

Our popular sports club will be back next term! Children participate in a range of activities designed for maximum enjoyment and the development of team-building skills and fitness.

Thursdays 1530-1630: Drama with Antonia Whittick Minimum of 10 children required £4.50 per session, £27 for the block

Antonia is a professional actor who has taught LAMDA and drama workshops at local schools for the past 5 years. The drama will club will introduce the LAMDA syllabus and fun improvisation drama games to build confidence and develop self-expression. The syllabus is designed to develop good reading skills, increasing fluency and understanding of written text. It aims to expand vocabulary and improve powers of self-expression. Pupils' confidence in speaking in public and listening improves, as does their memory and recall of information. LAMDA also develops a love of literature, poetry and drama.





- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
