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A note from the Head

Dear Parents and Carers

Another super week at Kings Nympton! We had Mr Chaplin our Education Consultant in school on Tuesday, he spent the morning in classrooms talking to the children about their learning and looking through their learning folders. We are very pleased to have all the hard work recognised. Here's a snippet of what he had to say:

Quality of Education

Leaders have sustained high expectations for the quality of the learning environment; these are consistent across the Federation. Systems are very clear and adhered to. The learning culture in classrooms is very positive. As a result, pupils focus very well on their learning and display attitudes that effectively support learning. In planning, teachers elicit pupils' prior knowledge and pupils then demonstrate progress in the curriculum with end of unit assessments. In science, for example, a pupil made progress in the knowledge of what plants need to survive by the end of a unit when understanding was not secure at the beginning.

It was fantastic to see so many people at the Friends of Kings Nympton AGM on Monday. Thank you to everyone who attended, there were some brilliant fundraising ideas being discussed. The position for secretary was also filled, thank you to Mrs French for stepping into the role. The next event is the Halloween Disco, which sounds very exciting. Don't forget to pre-book tickets on the Gateway.

Well done to our Year 5 and 6 children who took part in Bikeability this week, the instructor was very impressed with all the children who took part and their road sense. Well done.

It was so lovely to see the children playing at playtime this week, we have gone back to separate playgrounds for Reception, Year 1, 2 and 3. They rotate on a daily basis which means that our younger children have the opportunity to play on the big playground without footballs flying about. So far the feedback has been very positive.

Another great day for Forest School last week, the children certainly are having adventures each week! Last week they had another go with the strikers to light cotton pads before going on an adventure up to the top of the wood, they took the storm kettle and made hot chocolate. Then they did some activities based around our senses- finding things which were smooth, shiny etc. The children made potions for our sense of smell and all smelt each others to see if it was different. They sat guietly for 5 minutes to listen to forest noises- Year 2 found this quite tricky! They carried on their adventure and ended up back at the campfire circle for lunch followed by playing, weaving Gods eyes, cooking s'mores and playing in the river. What a busy day! I can't wait to hear about Year 3 and 4's adventures today.

It would be great to see some more scarecrow entries for our harvest competition on Thursday; I wonder what will turn up! We would be really grateful to receive donations of cakes etc for the cake sale at 3pm when the scarecrow results will be announced. Thank you in advance. Our bacon roll morning raised £60, this will be put together with the £210 raised at Winkleigh and will pay for the Christmas Elf visit. The commission on the Christmas Cards also raised £100 which is fantastic and will go in to the trips pot.

UNIFORM



SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 1

We have had a great week in Class 1. The children have really settled back into school life and are working hard. It is a pleasure to see their enthusiasm for all the lessons and activities they undertake!

Reception have been learning to say, read and write the next few phonemes and have been using these to read their first books in class. They have been talking and thinking about their own families and comparing them to Spinderella's family in the book by Julia Donaldson. They have been finding ways to sort different objects by looking at their colour, shape and size.

In English, Year 1 and 2 have been writing their own versions of the story *Knock! Knock! Open the Door*. They have used their learning in this unit to improve their writing and have written some great stories.


In Maths, Year 1 have been ordering objects and numbers to 10, using ordinal numbers and learning how a number line can be used to help them solve problems. Year 2 have started a unit of work on Addition and Subtraction. They have been finding fact families, comparing number sentences and looking for related facts in these.

Other lessons have included finding out about Northern Ireland, thinking about the properties of materials, having a go at colour mixing with paints and writing their own prayers.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 2

Another week has flown by, and the children have been working hard.

In Science, Year 3 and 4 have continued their learning about fossils and rocks. The children have learned about Mary Anning and have created their own fact file about her. We have also learned about soil formations and the four complements that make up soil. In Maths, Year 3 and 4 have finished their



sequence on place value and have started their new sequence on addition and subtraction. We have been using concrete resources to support us in adding numbers together and have introduced column method for addition.

In English, Year 5 and 6 have been developing their setting descriptions and have been varying their sentence starters and using subordinating conjunctions to connect sentences. They have been using these skills to create a setting description and engage the reader in their text.





If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
