

#### SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS













#### Class 1

The class have been working very hard this week. We all enjoyed welcoming our parents into our class-room and sharing the work we have been doing in Geography and Science. Everyone enjoyed the bacon rolls too!

Reception have been learning to say, read and write the next few phonemes they must learn as well as talking and thinking about what makes them special. They have been finding pairs of objects and looking at matching things.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have been writing their own questions and exclamatory sentences about our classroom, thinking of words to describe a friend and using the conjunction 'and' to make their sentences longer. In Maths, Year 1 have been comparing numbers using inequality signs and Year 2 have been ordering numbers to one hundred and counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s.

Other lessons have included finding out about Scotland, making a magnetic fishing game and learning to draw some facial features. Today was our last Forest School day this term. We all loved it and can't wait until the Summer term! Thank you Mrs Blacker.

#### SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 2

Another busy week in Class 2. Year 5 and 6 have completed their sequence in Maths on place value and have started our topic on addition and subtraction. We have been identifying mistakes in methods and focusing on explaining why they are incorrect and how we can correct them. Year 3 and 4 have been learning about Roman numerals. Have a great weekend Class 2.

In Science, Year 3 and 4 have been learning about the fossilisation process and have been explaining the steps of the process. Year 5 and 6 have been writing the results to their magnetic experiment and explaining why their predictions were either correct or incorrect.

In English we have been creating both setting and character descriptions, focusing on making our sentences cohesive and varying our sentence starters.


Thank you to all parents who came into the classroom yesterday to share breakfast with your children and to see some of their learning. Thanks to Mrs Dyke for serving the drinks.

- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
