This week in the Preschool the children have continued learning through our exciting dinosaur theme, which has sparked lots of curiosity, creativity, and conversation! The children enjoyed talking about dinosaurs and exploring ideas around size from tiny dinosaurs to enormous ones. We compared big and small, used descriptive language, and encouraged the children to share their own thoughts and ideas.

Our creative area was very busy as the children experimented with paint and colour mixing. They discovered how new colours can be made by mixing different paints together, developing both their fine motor skills and early scientific thinking. The children took part in a dinosaur hunt, searching carefully and looking high and low! This activity encouraged teamwork, problem solving, and lots of excitement as we explored the school grounds.

It has been a lovely week full of learning through play, imagination, and hands on experiences.

Class 1 – Mrs Betts

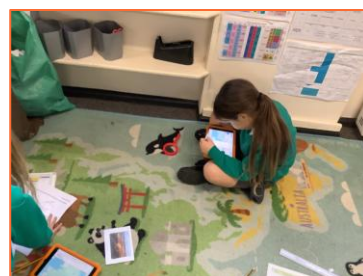
This week in class one, we have been reading the Minpins by Roald Dahl and creating our own adventures in the creepy, gloomy woods. The children have created questions to ask the Minpins and are learning how to use different types of punctuation in their sentences. In reception, the children are basing their drawings and coding on the story of Little Red Riding Hood. They have invented traps and magical vehicles to outwit the cunning wolf.

In maths, KS1 have been learning to add and subtract two 2-digit numbers, while reception have been concentrating on number composition, making pairs and combining groups.

In art, the children have been learning about Kandinsky and tessellation. I wonder if you can explain tessellation! In science, the children are learning about healthy diets and were tasked with picking a healthy meal from the menu, and then discussing what made this the healthy choice. In RE, the children have been thinking about the meaning of peace and what they do to find peace. We had some great suggestions reading, listening to music, cuddling teddy's and exercise.

Reception joined preschool for a dinosaur hunt because the egg had hatched!

Class 2 – Mrs Miali

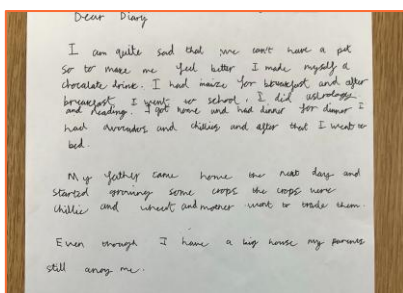
This week (and month) has flown by. The children have had a very productive week, completing sequences in maths and English and starting the new ones.

The children wrote some fantastic pages in English on how to care for a Yeti. I now know you must only feed a yeti cold food, in particular strawberry ice cream; have a team of walkers to help when exercising them and to choose my perfect yeti I need to know what colour the snowball egg glows. What amazing imagination displayed by the class.

To finish the maths sequence, we focused on division and what to do when you can't divide a number equally. Using the place value counters and charts to demonstrate this process visually really helped the children's understanding of exchanging and remainders. We are moving on to length and measurement next week, that will lend itself to using lots of equipment.

As the children have been developing their writing skills so well, we took the opportunity to use them in history. The class researched about the daily life of a Mayan and then used the key information to write a diary entry, as though they had lived a day during ancient Maya civilization times.

Next week our swimming lessons will begin. These will be taking place on Wednesday. Please make sure your child has easy to put on, warm clothes and suitable footwear to walk back to school in after the lesson. Please also remember to complete the online consent, as well as return the SOE3 form before Wednesday morning.
