Happy New Year!

We hope you all had a lovely Christmas.

It was great to see the children back in school... eventually! They have been excitedly sharing their Christmas news with their friends.

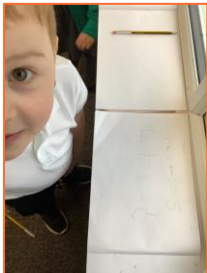
In class, we have jumped straight in to Drawing Club and Curious Quest. The children have been imagining and writing narratives based upon one of their Christmas presents, a secret note and magical codes.

In maths, reception have been looking at the composition of the number 5. While, KS1 have been learning about addition and subtraction within 100. Specifically, this week learning about related facts and if you know $5+2=7$, can you work out $50+20=?$ In computing, we have learning about the internet and how to stay safe online. Today the children were learning about how the internet has helped and changed our lives. The children looked at things that we had to do in 1992, and saw how the internet has allowed us to do things very differently.

In art, the children have been learning about the artist Wassily Kandinsky and had a go at painting concentric circles.

Class 2 – Mrs Miali

After a delayed start to the week it has been lovely to welcome everyone back and meet the new members of our class. Everyone has settled in well and have found their feet with the daily routine.

The start of the new spring term means lots of new and exciting topics to learn about. For English the new book is called 'Dare to Care for a Pet Dragon' which is, surprisingly, a non-fiction book, teaching the reader how to look after your very own dragon – if you are brave enough!

In maths the whole class are revisiting multiplication and division and will be using our previous learnt knowledge to progress into formal methods of multiplying and divided by 2-digit numbers. They have started the unit well, recapping their array knowledge to learn about factor pairs.

The science sequence this half term is 'Animals including humans.' We will be focusing on the digestive system; teeth and food webs. In RE we are moving on to Hinduism and looking at why their beliefs are structured around being good and understanding their views of karma. The Ancient Maya civilisation will be the focus in history and understanding how their civilisation was constructed. Computing and PSHE involve lots of cross-curricular learning about keeping safe, particularly online and using the internet – paramount importance with how much we use technology now.

The artist we are focusing on within the art sequence is Frida Kahlo. Exploring her style of self-portraits, the pupils will create their own and their finished masterpieces will become part of the schools art display for the church over the February half term.
