### THE LEARNING ZONE



SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 1



This week, Reception have been learning all about different types of healthy foods and meals. They have created a healthy packed lunch box; talked about their favourite meals; learnt a 'Colours of the Rainbow' song; found food to match these colours and have thought of words that rhyme with some of the colours. They have continued with their learning about numbers beyond 10 and making some numbers to 20 using a variety of maths equipment.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have started a unit of work using the book, *I Love Bugs* by Emma Dodd. This is a narrative poem and the children will be creating their own narrative poems at the end of this sequence. This week, they have been developing their understanding of noun phrases by playing with the order of adjectives to describe some insects and inventing their own 'bug' and writing a description for a partner to use to draw it. In Maths, Year 1 have started a unit of work on multiplication and division. They have been counting in 10s, recognising and describing equal and unequal groups and adding equal groups (in the form of repeated addition). Year 2 have started a unit of work on position and direction. They have been using mathematical language to describe the position of objects and the movements they make.

In other lessons, the children have been finding the 7 continents and 5 oceans of the world using atlases, sorting animals into groups based on what they eat, making their own fish sculpture using plastic bottles, using Chrome Music Lab to make their own music and thinking about how we can protect our world.

A busy week, Class 1, well done!

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 2

Class 2 have been busy working in groups this week to develop their own creative recounts. Firstly, they had to select a variety of time connective words, then they had to share their ideas to devise an existing recount. In the blink of an eye, they were writing and by the end of the lesson they shared their work!

We also enjoyed two really hands-on science experiments on Wednesday, with Year 5 and 6 exploring how the body takes the goodness out of food and leaves a waste product. We did this using Skittles! Year 3 and 4 submerged eggs in different liquids (vinegar, cola, orange juice and an energy drink) to replicate how they can impact our teeth.

Class 2 had a visit from the Outreach team at MED theatre on Monday. They were treated to a drama and storytelling workshop about the Bronze Age, exploring the life and legends of that era. The session drew on local knowledge from Exmoor and Dartmoor to help us develop an understanding of Bronze Age society and culture.

#### Don't forget we have our immersive

Space Dome Day with our friends from Winkleigh on Tuesday. Thank you to parents and carers for organising lift shares amongst yourselves so that we can avoid the high cost of coach travel. Children can be dropped at Winkleigh from 0850 but no later than 0915 and should be collected again at 1500. Everyone needs a packed lunch, apart from those children eligible for FSM who have already made lunch bookings. We are all really looking forward to an exciting day.

Finally, we were all relieved that the forecast thunderstorms didn't materialise and Years 3 and 4 were able to make it to Forest School today. The rain passed quite quickly and the sun shone.

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
