

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS



Class 1

We have all had a very busy last week of term. We have had a Christmas Craft Fair, performed our School Nativity, had a visit from one of Santa's elves and even managed to get our Christmas dinner. Although we have been unable to use the playground (due to the weather) all the children have had great fun and really proved what adaptable children they are. As well as all these activities, we have also been completing our half term units of work.

Reception have been discussing and recording the things they and their family do on Christmas day (including eating a burger for Christmas tea!). In Maths activities, they have been learning about night and day, the days of the week and looking at our advent calendar for counting forwards and backwards.

In English, Year 1 and 2 have been writing descriptively about a character from The Jolly Christmas Postman, writing letters and have completed the unit by writing a letter to Father Christmas. In Maths lessons, Year 1 have been continuing to work with the numbers from eleven to twenty and completing some Christmas addition and subtraction activities. Year 2 have continued with their work on multiplication and division. They have been learning how to create and use arrays to write repeated addition sums.

Class 2

A snowy start to the last week of term. It has been a strange week this week in Class 2 with the weather conditions, well done to all the children who have adapted seamlessly this week to the restrictions the weather has placed on us.

In English this week the children have created a story board for their own Christmas advert, following the same pattern as Mog's Christmas Calamity. The children planned their advert on a story board and then used this to transform their advert into a short narrative.

In Maths Years 3 and 4 have continued their sequence on length and perimeter and the children have been converting units of measure from cm to mm and cm to m. The children used this to compare different lengths of measurement.

Years 5 and 6 have concluded their learning on fractions and have started to look at ratio. This week we welcomed parents in for our Christmas Fayre and craft afternoon, the children enjoyed sharing their craft with you and making baubles and snowflakes. Thank you to all the parents that were able to come due to the weather conditions.

Well done to all the children in Class 2 who supported Class 1 in their nativity as the choir on Wednesday afternoon after the snow sadly postponed it on Monday. On Wednesday we enjoyed our Christmas lunch, the children enjoyed eating together in class with festive music and crackers popping. The children looked very festive in their Christmas jumpers.

Should I keep my **child off school?**

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.

It takes less than a minute to apply.
