We have had another lovely week in Owls Class this week. The children were very excited to begin their phonics sessions, and have joined in so well to learn all the new letters and sounds. They have practised forming the letters using a variety of different methods, but writing in coloured sand and glitter was definitely their favourite! *Perhaps you could find some fun ways to practise writing the letters learnt so far at home?*

In maths, the children have loved using the story 'A Squash and a Squeeze' to help them count forwards and backwards, match numerals to the story and also to estimate how many animals they might be able to squeeze into different boxes!

As part of our RE work this week we have thought about special occasions. We read stories about birthdays, decorated our little wooden house ready for a party and had some lovely pretend birthday tea parties!

Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast



This week we began a new unit of learning in English. We are learning the text 'Oi Frog!' by Kes Gray and Jim Field. We have had lots of fun with the rhyming words in the story and tried to come up with some of our own rhyming words. *Can you think of three words that rhyme with frog?*



In Maths we have been continuing our work with numbers to 10. We have been counting forwards and backwards and considering one more and one less. *Can you draw a picture to show one less than 12? 10 in word form?*

In Science we have planted beans in different conditions, as an experiment to see how they grow. In Computing we thought about what 'technology' means and located items of technology in the classroom. *Can you find some technology in your home?*

We are doing well with our running, clocking up the miles to Lapland!










Year 2—Miss Jones

Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Week two of Year 3 has certainly flown by! It was lovely to see so many parents and carers at our welcome meeting on Wednesday.

We have continued our sequence of place value in maths, thinking about number lines to 1000, adding and subtracting 1/10/100 and representing numbers to 1000 in various ways. In English, we have learnt the story of the Lord of the Forest, focusing on elements we like, dislike and notice patterns in. We have begun to learn how to punctuate direct speech using inverted commas.

In science, we have produced creative fact files about the life of Mary Anning based on the knowledge we acquired during our English sequence last week.

We discovered more about the structure of the Earth in geography and labelled crosssection diagrams.

I have been impressed with how well the children have risen to the challenge of Year 3! Have a lovely weekend and I look forward to seeing you on Tuesday.







Year 4—Miss McLean

What a fantastic week we've had in Year Four! We have worked hard on our presentation this week, especially in maths. We have continued to learn about place value and have been using part whole models to partition four-digit numbers in multiple ways.

In English, we have moved onto our learning sequence based around the text 'The Great Kapok Tree' by Lynne Cherry. This sequence also links to our learning in Geography about rainforests. This week we have read the start of the book and made some fantastic predictions about what we think will come next.

In geography on Wednesday, we looked at what biomes are and discovered where each biome can be found in the world. *Can you remember where the rainforest biomes are?* This week, we have also enjoyed beginning to use times tables rock stars in school. Your children's logins are stuck in the front of their Superstar reading record for them to log on and have a go at home.

In English, we have started to take an in-depth look into the works of Rudyard Kipling and the Jungle Book. While in maths, we have been manipulating numbers up to one million, thinking about different ways to represent the number.

Our trip to Ultimate Adventure on Wednesday was fantastic. It was so great to see challenges being overcome, fears faced and the high levels of teamwork and encouragement between the whole class.

Year 6—Mr Davis

It has been so lovely to welcome the children in for their first full week in Year 6. Firstly, our trip to Ultimate Adventure on Wednesday was fantastic. The children certainly built on their experiences from last year and it was fantastic for them to comment on the progress they had made. For example, 'I couldn't do that last year, but now I can!' There were also so many examples of great teamwork and collaboration - which we have been working on together this week. They were brave and energetic and polite for the whole day. So much so that the site manager complimented us as staff on their behaviour.

In the classroom this week, we have started our next English teaching sequence about a book called 'Freedom Bird' which is set before the Civil War in America. The children have been predicting and familiarising themselves with the text this week. In Maths, we have finished our first sequence on Place Value. Year 6 have been learning how to use number lines, place value grids and part-whole models to demonstrate their understanding. In Art, Year 6 have studied a new graphic artist - M. C. Thompson. They have emulated his work by creating a bookcase about themselves in his style. Finally, in ICT, Year 6 have been inputting data into spreadsheets and learning about the features of the software that allows them to order, calculate and change the units at the click of a button. If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
