### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

Another busy week has flown by and it has once again been non-stop in Owls Class! In phonics this week the children have begun blending letters to make and read short words. We have been so impressed with the speed at which they have picked this up. They are also enjoying writing these letters as well as finding objects that begin with the same initial sound as the letters taught so far.

In maths this week our learning has been based on the Frog and Toad story 'The Lost Button'. The children have sorted, counted and decorated their own coats for frog using an array of different coloured, sized and shaped buttons. They have also been practising doing up and undoing buttons on their own clothes as well as clothes for the dolls!

We had a lovely walk to the local Church on Thursday. The children were so well behaved and interested in finding out more about all the different objects and symbols found within the church. They enjoyed seeing a real font, relating this to their learning in class last week about Christian Baptisms.

As part of our PSED work this week the children listened really well to the story 'How to fill a bucket' and thought of all the ways they can be kind, helpful and a good friend in order to fill people's buckets as well as their own.

We are all thoroughly looking forward to our trip to Bear Town next week! Please can we remind you to ensure children wear socks on this day as shoes are not allowed to be worn within the role play areas.

We hope you have been enjoying sharing books with your children either online or from one of the ones sent home. *Please can we remind you that school library books need to be in books bags on a Friday in order to be changed each week, and school reading books must be in book bags on a Tuesday.* Don't forget to write in your child's reading record books too. ### Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

This week we began new sequence based on 'The Train Ride' by June Crebbin. This is a poem with the rhythm of a train chugging along the track. We had great fun making train tracks and journeys in the classroom using toy trains. On Wednesday we had our own journey to Rosemoor and we will use this as a good discussion point about travel and what we could observe from the bus window. We had a wonderful time!

In Maths we have been working on addition and subtraction this week. We have been creating part-whole models and learning about the relationship between a group of three numbers. We have introduced the term 'fact families' which is when three numbers can be rearranged into four different addition and subtraction calculations. For example, the numbers 4, 6 and 10 can be used to create 4+6=10, 6+4=10, 10-4=6 and 10-6=4.

In Geography we enjoyed a trip around the village. We talked about what we would see before we headed out and had a good discussion about the difference between physical and man-made features. We visited the Post Office and then posted our letters home.

This week's PSHE was all about recognising when we are hurt. We talked about how we can be physically hurt and need to receive first aid or special care. Then we discussed what we can do if our feelings are hurt and how to care for ourselves emotionally.



### Year 2-Miss Jones

This week in Maths we have started our new sequence on addition and subtraction. We consolidated our knowledge of known facts from Year 1 and linking our number bonds from 10 to 100. We looked at adding and subtracting ones from a two-digit number using bead



strings and hundred squares at the end of the week.

In English we have started our shared write and the children are practicing writing in paragraphs and extending their ideas independently.

In Geography we learned more facts about Antarctica and structured these in a fact file. In Science we learned about food chains and structured our own, using the new vocabulary **producer, consumer and predator.** 



In Art we have been combining our skills of using the primary colours and geometric shapes to plan our final piece.

We enjoyed practicing our dribbling skills in football out on the field and then learning about harvest in RE.

### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Another excellent week in Year 3, well done everyone! In maths, we have started our new sequence based on addition and subtraction. We have focused on adding 1s, 10s and 100s. Today, we were busy spotting patterns in a range of number sentences.

English has seen us learn to punctuate direct speech, remembering to start with inverted commas and include punctuation. We used the 'Edgar the Dragon' John Lewis video as a stimulus for our writing on Wednesday as we imagined the conversations that could have been taking place. The children have also worked hard on using and identifying verbs and nouns.

In science, we learnt more about the life and legacy of Mary Anning, discussing the role that she played in palaeontology. Geography involved looking more closely at earthquakes and why they occur. The children considered key vocabulary and the five potential deadly effects of them.

### Year 4-Miss McLean

This week in English, Year Four have been learning about poetry. We began the week by getting to know a few poems from our key text by performing them. We discussed how to give a good performance by using your voice and body. There were some very enthusiastic performances!

In maths, the children have been recalling their knowledge of column addition from Year Three to add two 4-digit numbers together. Next week we will move on to using this same method for subtraction.

On Monday in science, we focused on the skill of measuring scientifically. The children practiced using thermometers and stopwatches to measure accurately. They will put this into practice in the next couple of weeks when planning and carrying out some experiments.

### Year 5—Mr Walter

Well done Year 5 on another fantastic week! In English, we have been busy exploring peculiar words finding their meanings and applying them into sentences and our writing. In maths, we have been emphasising the importance to use the acronym of RUCSAC to check through addition and subtraction calculations that include multi-step problems and using the inverse operations.

In Geography, we have use practical activity to show how mountains can be formed. An example was pushing two slices of bread together to watch it fold. Additionally, in RE we used our trip to Exeter Cathedral in Year 3 to build our understanding of the use of Cathedrals across the UK.

Finally, in PE we were able to apply our learnt skills from Tag Rugby to build into an opposed scenario.

Well done Year 5, have a good weekend!







### Year 6-Mr Davis

The children of Year 6 have all worked very hard this week. In English, they have finished their teaching sequence about Freedom Bird by researching and creating a biography of the abolitionist Harriet Tubman using the language and vocabulary they have encountered in their sequence so far. They have had to plan their content, consider the reader's experience and ensure that their vocabulary is clear and well explained. I have been very impressed with their results!

In Maths, Year 6 have been learning about common factors and multiples as well as prime numbers. They have also learnt some strategies for mental division using digit totals and reasoning to help them. It has been a challenging week!

In Science this week, Year 6 have learnt about the components of the eye and what they all do. They also conducted a short safe experiment on how light effects the iris and pupil.







In PSHE this week, the children have been learning about consent, how they can report concerns and what the law is for children surrounding adulthood and marriage. They had some scenarios to discuss before watching a video hosted by Childline. The Art lesson this week has involved the children using sketching pencils to create optical illusions in the style of the illustrator Escher. They had to consider the point of focus, the perspective and how they were going to 'fool' the person viewing the image. I do hope you all have a lovely weekend.

## YEAR 1 RHS ROSEMOOR

WEDNESDAY 4TH OCTOBER 2023

### On Wednesday, Year 1 went on an adventure!

We left school and followed a map one of the children had drawn in preparation for the trip. We waited for the bus to arrive and climbed on and headed to Rosemoor. We got off and walked down the path to Rosemoor Gardens. We felt very proud of ourselves coming in under our own steam.

We learnt about what seeds need to grow—water, warmth and soil. One lucky volunteer was a seed, he was watered and added soil to and he grew! We then went out to plant our own seeds, hopefully they made it home!

After that we walked around the garden looking for evergreen and deciduous trees. We found lots of beautifully coloured leaves that we brought back to the classroom and

made a sticky flower with them. We had our lunch in the cob nook and made our way back to the bus. What an exciting day. The children were a pleasure and they thoroughly enjoyed the day!























## YEAR 4 EDEN PROJECT

WEDNESDAY 4TH OCTOBER 2023



On Wednesday, Year Four went to the Eden Project to support their learning in geography about tropical rainforests. In the morning, after an introduction to Eden, we explored the Mediterranean biome.

In the afternoon, the children took part in a rainforest rangers workshop where they leant how to use plants from the rainforest to provide water, shelter and food. The children first learnt what it means to be a Rainforest Ranger and the importance of this as a job before getting to explore the tropical rainforest biome.

Throughout the day, it was lovely to hear staff at Eden commenting on how well the children were not only being respectful towards the plants and environment that they were exploring, but also the staff too.


