SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Nursery (Squirrels & Hedgehogs)—Mrs Stapley

This week we have been singing all our favourite nursery rhymes and some less familiar songs. We have especially enjoyed Hickory Dickory Dock! *Ask your children if they can sing the whole rhyme at home.* Other activities this week have included; making mice using craft resources, rolling out play dough mice, printing sheep for Little Bo Peep and using our counting skills and key vocabulary: 'more' 'less' 'fewer' 'greater' linked to 'The Wheels on the Bus' rhyme. We have had a brilliant time outside using the wheeled toys, digging and finding treasure in the sand and playing with the water toys. If your child has a favourite book they would like to bring in next week, we'd love to share it with the class. Thank you for your continued support.













Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

In Owls Class this week the children have enjoyed listening to a range of different stories linked to our topics. We thought about 'people who help us' on Monday and Owls enjoyed dressing up as police officers, vets, doctors and construction workers thinking about how each of these people might help us. On Tuesday "Tattybogle the Scarecrow" was our story and the children worked well together as a team to make their own scarecrow linked to the book. In maths this week the children have been focusing on the language of 'more', 'most', 'fewer', and 'fewest' and have been using counting frames and safari animals to help them with this concept linked to the story 'We're all going on safari.' I wonder if you can make some collections of animals at home this weekend and see which collection has the most or the fewest animals? In R.E. the children learnt about the Hindu celebration of Raksha Bandan. This is a day when sisters tie a bracelet called a rakhi around the wrists of their brothers to symbolise their love and good wishes for them. The children enjoyed making rakhis for one another and as part of our circle time they gave their friends a special rakhi and thought about what made them a special friend. The children have worked hard on their phonics again this week and are beginning to put letters together to both read and write their own words now. Well done Owls, keep up the hard work and don't forget to read a good book over the weekend! Our focus for show and tell next week will be 'our pets' or 'our favourite animals.' We would love it if the children could either bring in photographs of their pets, or a soft toy to show what their favourite animal is. As part of our RE work next week we are hoping to be able to visit the local Church so please can parents ensure their child brings a coat to school with them.













SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

We began our new English sequence this week which is based on the book 'Transport' by Ruth Thompson. We have been looking at how we travel to school as a class and created our own chart to display the results. **Can you describe your journey to school to someone at home?**

In Maths we also began a new unit of learning and we are focusing on addition and part-whole models. We have thought about the addition symbol and how it is used within a number sentence. Can you draw a part-whole model at home? How are the numbers linked?

This week we also enjoyed a stroll around the village as part of our Geography learning about our local area. We talked about landmarks, shops and places of interest. This linked nicely with the class visit to the Church last week in RE. **What can you see on a visit to Winkleigh?**









Year 2—Miss Jones

Another busy week has flown by. In English we have been developing our shared writing in preparation for our independent write next week. I have been impressed by the children's sentences and vocabulary choices, well done everyone!

In Maths we have continued with our addition and subtraction learning. We explored adding 1s to a two-digit number, applying our number bonds when adding larger numbers and adding together three one-digit numbers. We have been focusing on presenting our learning in our books and writing one number per square as well as structuring our calculations carefully.

On Monday in Geography we wrote our own fact files about Antarctica. We learned about its location by looking at a globe and other interesting facts about its climate and the animals that live there. In Science we learned about food chains and focused on the vocabulary of producer, consumer, predator and energy. We worked in our table groups to construct a food chain ourselves and presented them to the class, thinking carefully about applying the key vocabulary in our explanations.

On Thursday we continued with our drawing topic by completing a self portrait, using the sketching techniques that we learned so far. We are all very excited for our school trip and look forward to sharing photos of our visit and learning next week.

Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have enjoyed another successful week. We have completed our independent writing based on the Lord of the Forest story. I have been impressed with the children's writing stamina and their application of their knowledge.

In maths, we are looking at adding amounts of tens and ones where we need to cross a boundary. We have begun adding using column method today.

During science, we learnt about soil formation and the various processes involved. We used our collagraphs that we created to print in art this week, with fantastic results. We will be evaluating our work next week.

Geography saw us locating a number of volcanoes around the world and looking to see any current eruptions! There has continued to be lots of reading at home this week which is fantastic, as well as the use of Times Tables Rock Stars.

Year 4—Miss McLean

It's been a busy week in Year Four this week. We had an amazing time at the Eden Project on Wednesday and some very tired children on Thursday!

In maths this week, we have begun our new sequence in maths of 'Addition and Subtraction' by looking at column addition with exchanging. Next week, we will continue this learning by learning to use the same method with subtraction.

In English on Monday, we finished writing our final persuasive letters encouraging people not to cut down trees in the rainforests.

On Monday afternoon, we began making some poppies for Remembrance Day. So far we have cut out the shapes that we will need from red and black felt and are looking forward to continuing making them next week.

Finally, in RE this week we learnt about the Hindu deity Ganesh and the story of how he got his elephant head.

Year 5—Mr Walter


The weeks are flying by in Year 5! This week we have been writing and editing our very own animal origin stories based around Rudyard Kipling's Just So Stories. There have been some wonderful ideas including how the leopard got its spots and how the rabbit lost its tail.



In maths, we have been exploring addition and subtraction focussing on using our place value understanding to add up to four digit numbers with exchanges. Throughout the week we have been looking into different methods and representations that could be used.









There is still time to enter the Harry Potter competition, by drawing, writing about or building your very own plant creature that would fit into Professor Sprouts Herbology class.

Year 6—Mr Davis

We really have had an incredibly busy week. In English, we have completed a week long teaching sequence about the opera Aidan - adapted from Amadigi by Handel. The children have made predictions, written a love song, considered the features of tragedies and comedies and then written their own version of a chivalrous tale. They really have worked hard

In Maths, the children have looked at factors, multiples, square and cube numbers, primes and long multiplication. Again excellent efforts and concentration from the whole class! In Science, Year 6 have learned how a light beam reflects off an object and enters the eye.

They have learned the key components of the eye and what their jobs are within the process.

In Geography, Year 6 have considered the different uses we have for land both locally and nationally. They have also considered the potential future problems we may encounter.

In RE, Year 6 have looked at the Ten Commandments from the Christian Bible and which of them are applicable to British law and way this might be. This inspired a fantastic whole class discussion about the importance of law and order!

PSHE this week has revolved around being assertive within a friendship group and what strategies the children may

wish to use should they need to.

Finally, I would like to say how successful the children have been in their letter writing to local and national companies to ask for prizes for our Christmas Raffle - we have already received some excellent donations! Have a lovely weekend.





YEAR 4—EDEN PROJECT



On Wednesday, Year 4 and Class 2 from Kings Nympton went to the Eden Project...

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
