#### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

This week in Owls Class the Christmas spirit is most definitely beginning to take over! The children were very excited to receive a letter from Santa on Tuesday and have all begun writing their own letters back. We are hoping to walk up to the Post Office next week to post our letters once we have finished writing them.

In maths this week, the children have been finding ways to compose numbers using salt dough, natural materials and multilink cubes and have been talking about how they can 'see' numbers and how they can arrange the same amounts in different ways.

It has been wonderful to see the children beginning to use their phonics knowledge independently this week and we have seen tricky words, CVC words and even short sentences cropping up everywhere. Well done Owls, what amazing work!

The children have been busily preparing for our Christmas play on the 11th December, singing songs, acting out their parts and painting scenery. They are very excited about sharing The Nativity story with you all.

Next week will be our assessment week so there will be no new phonics sounds or tricky words taught. Have a restful weekend Owls ready for plenty more festive fun next week!

As we will be having our Christmas lunch on Tuesday along with our dress rehearsal, there will be no PE lesson for Owls Class on Tuesday.

















#### SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Year 1— Mrs Keast & Mrs Betts

In English we have been writing our shared story based upon 'Daisy Doodles'. We have been learning how verbs can be used to describe how an animal moves and we had fun thinking of lots of different words with a partner. Some of our favourite words were 'scampering' 'bobbing' and 'gliding'. We will try and use these in our writing next week to create some interesting stories.

In Maths we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes. We have enjoyed opportunities to explore the different shapes and have used them to create some models and pictures. Our discussion about shape includes thinking about the number of sides and corners/vertices each one has.

In Design Technology this week we designed a moving calendar which will feature a Christmas design. We put all our previous learning into practice by considering how we would make part of our picture move. We have created some original design ideas which feature wheel mechanisms, levers and sliders. Next week we will be making the calendars and then evaluating how it went.

#### Year 2—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

This week the Year 2s have been busy with their tests. They have worked really hard and focussed well and with a really mature frame of mind.

The children have been busy learning the school play. The characters are really developing and the children are adding personal touches being mindful about the audience. Tickets for the play will be sent home next week.

In Science, they have drawn from knowledge that they gained on their school trip last and remembered what a coastal environment was like. They thought about the animals and plants that survive there. The children loved making their layered fridge magnets in DT.

In RE, they have thought about how Christians believe God created the world—and how they, as responsible citizens can look after it through reducing, reusing and recycling.

In History, they have been comparing the equipment used for Polar Expeditions now, compared to what explorers would have used a hundred years ago. They had interesting and well observed discussions about the past and now, showing a good understanding of the differences.

Next week, we will be back on the normal schedule of English and Maths and we will continue the daily Christmas play rehearsals!









#### SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

We have been busy this week, completing our end of term assessment quizzes as well as visiting QE on our postponed orienteering trip! Luckily, we had a dry day to enjoy exploring the grounds of QE in Crediton. The children all behaved impeccably and took part in each of the challenges that had been planned for them to develop their orienteering skills.

On Monday, in English we worked on our comprehension of the text 'Mog's Christmas Calamity.' Maths has seen us learn about dividing by 3 and the 3x table this week. We have applied our knowledge of the times table facts up to 12 x 3 to help our work out more challenging questions.

History involved learning about the Ancient Egyptian Gods and Goddesses. We each chose one to draw and paint, representing their role in the civilisation. In science, we learnt about air and water resistance, applying this to create a force diagram.

We were very excited to find that the classroom had been decorated for Christmas this morning, with lots of things to look forward to over the next couple of weeks!

#### Year 4—Miss McLean

Year Four have worked incredibly hard this week to complete their quizzes. They also had a fantastic day on Tuesday attending the postponed orienteering event. The children thoroughly enjoyed the trip and all joined in with the various orienteering activities and races throughout the day.

This week we have also started our Christmassy sequence in English by reading 'The Show Globe'. The children had a go at plotting the key events in the story and making a story map with small illustrations.

In D&T on Thursday, the children used their designs from last week to make their own pizzas. Next week, they will have the opportunity to evaluate what they have made.

In history, we learnt about what daily life was like for the Maya. We knew that most people in the Mayan civilisation were farmers but also found out that they used cacao beans as a currency, and they made a special 'hot chocolate' drink which they flavoured with vanilla and honey.

#### Year 5—Mr Walter

Year 5 have done brilliantly this week with their first NFER quiz week of the year. Everyone showed resilience in their mature attitude to a different classroom environment. Elsewhere this week, we have continued our work with Year 6 in DT constructing our Christmas games, with our focus this week on how we can use glue guns to join mitre joints.

In PHSE, we have discussed different stereotypes that are in our society, highlighting the importance to prevent these from being said. Additionally, in RE we have focused on the Shahadah which extends our learning on the five pillars of Islam.

#### Year 6-Mr Davis

It has been assessment week in Year 6 this week. The class have undertaken the end of Key Stage assessments from 2022 - a reading paper, a grammar paper, a spelling paper and three maths papers. I have to say how impressed Mrs Gent, Mrs Nicks and myself have been with the children's efforts and resilience when encountering these sort of assessments for the first time. I know that they are all relieved that the week is over but it is an important week as it provides a great snapshot of where the children are with their learning now.

In Science this week, the children carried out the electrical experiments that they planned last week. Their focus was to consider what sort of data they were going to collect and how they were going to present their results.

In History, Year 6 have learnt about the wives of the Tudor King - Henry VIII. They learnt how he manipulated the law and the church to change is marriages and finished the lesson by creating 'Top Trump' cards, one for each wife! This week's RE lesson involved researching how the Judeo-Christian bible describes Heaven and Hell and how this relates to the world we live in. The children created a two-page spread of their research.

Finally, as it is the end of November, the children have been decorating their classroom in preparation for Mrs Fenemore's Christmas classroom competition. Hopefully we are in with a chance! Have a great weekend.

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- · Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
