Dear Parents and Carers,

#### Nursery (Squirrels & Hedgehogs)—Mrs Stapley

It was lovely to see the children after the half term holiday and hear their holiday news. This week we have based our learning around the text 'Dear Zoo' by Rod Campbell. The children enjoyed drawing and painting their own animal so we could make our own Dear Zoo book! They also made paper plate animal masks and looked at the size of different animals ordering them from the shortest/tallest/smallest to biggest. *Maybe over the weekend ask the children about the book and see if they can remember why each animal was sent back to the zoo!* 

Next week we will continue on the animal story theme and base our learning around a firm favourite of ours—'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

Owls have come back full of enthusiasm to learn and we have had a great first week back. Our focus this half term is 'festivals and celebrations' and we started by focusing on 'Halloween!' The children have counted all manner of strange creatures into their potions in maths, have recorded by drawing and writing simple words to create spells, and had great fun using their own wands to make some strange crackling potions on Tuesday! They have enjoyed dressing up in Halloween costumes and thoroughly enjoyed scooping all the seeds out of the pumpkins! In phonics, we are moving on to putting 3 letters together to both read and write CVC words this term. The children are continuing to practise forming their letters correctly as well as writing their own names independently.

In PE this week we took our lesson outside and had great fun dancing and moving to music. Next week we will be focusing on Guy Fawkes and Fireworks celebrations. We hope everyone is able to enjoy seeing some over the weekend in between the showers!

As part of our RE work this term we are thinking about how the festival of Christmas is special to Christians. We will be focusing on baby Jesus over the next few weeks and we would love it if the children could bring in a photograph of themselves as a baby to share with the class on Wednesday.

Please can we remind parents that their children should come to school in PE kit on Tuesdays and Fridays and ensure that they have trainers or shoes suitable for running around in on these days.















SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Year 1— Mrs Keast & Mrs Betts

This week we began a new text in our English, a non-fiction book entitled 'Knights'. We have enjoyed reading the text and learning about these features of an information text: contents page, glossary, index. We have also focused on the individual pages and how the information is presented to us. We know that the pages have a subheading, picture, speech bubble and bold text. *Can you tell someone at home what you know about knights?* 

In Maths we have worked on subtraction. We have been using a number line to count backwards and answer simple calculations. The children have had an interesting discussion about how our knowledge of number bonds can help us when subtracting from 10.

We began our Design Technology sequence this week and looked at the features of some pop-up books. We enjoyed looking at how the pages came alive and how it added to the story. Then we had a go at creating our own sliders, thinking about how we could design the page and add a suitable background. *Do you have any pop-up books at home? Can you see how the mechanisms work?* 

Next week in English we will be thinking about the jobs our parents/carers do. The children will be writing some simple interview questions on Wednesday to bring home and ask. *If you could please spend 5 minutes answering and noting a simple response that would be appreciated.* We will then use this information to write about jobs at the end of the week. Thank you!



#### Year 2-Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

What a great week we have had! It has been a pleasure teaching the class, they have been working very hard. We have begun a new sequence in English on a book called *The Dragon Machine*. They children have been enthralled by the picture within the book and the accompanying narrative. They have been learning and using vocabulary from within the book and producing quality sentences. Individual reading books and love of reading books went home on Wednesday. Stickers will be rewarded for 5 lots of home reading!

In maths we have been looking at bridging through 10 when adding or subtracting numbers.

In science, the children have begun to produce a fact book about animals and their different habitats. We began with the Polar regions.

In history we have been learning about explorers from the past and present. *If you have time, please talk or show your child pictures of different explorers and where they have explored*. Sir Francis Drake was a well known local explorer—Buckland Abbey is a local National Trust property where the famous explorer lived. If you have membership it would be a great place to visit to support their understanding of explorers from the past.

We are looking forward to giving out parts for the Christmas play next week and we have been learning the songs already! Enjoy the fireworks and stay safe.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

It has been lovely to see everyone back today, I hope you all managed to dodge the showers and winds! Year 3 have been working hard this week after half term. We have tackled column subtraction with 2 and 3-digit numbers where we have needed to exchange. We will be consolidating this next week and coming to the end of our addition and subtraction sequence. English has seen us learn the story of Paddington. We have considered each of the characters and created profiles, ranking their qualities, helping us to compare them. We have also been doing lots of work on writing sentences that make sense, have capital letters, end punctuation and a verb. The children are becoming really confident at identifying sentences that are correct! Across the foundation subjects we have been busy beginning our new sequences. This has included forces in science and the Ancient Egyptians in history, where we made inferences about the civilisation based on artefacts and images.

In PE on Wednesday, we began our gymnastics sequence, considering the key words of strength, static and balance.

Thank you very much to everyone who has donated baking for our cake sale!

Please may I remind parents that every child needs to be bringing a coat to school everyday now. Have a lovely weekend and I look forward to seeing you all on Monday!

#### Year 4—Miss McLean

Year Four have had a fantastic first week back this half term and are getting stuck into their new sequences of learning already!

In maths, we have focused on area this week. The children have been finding the area of rectilinear shapes by counting squares. They have also made their own shapes with given areas and compared the area of shapes using greater than, less than and equal to. Next week in maths we will be moving on to multiplication and division.

In English this week, we have been getting to know our new book 'Myth Atlas'. The children have learnt some of these myths by creating actions to go with it and performing this to the class. We will be looking in some more detail at the ingredients of myths next week.

We learnt about the water cycle in science and discussed the impact that Global Warming is having on the rates of evaporation. In the remaining subjects, we have started our new sequences. SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Year 5—Mr Walter

Year 5 have had a great week back engaging with our learning for the new term. In English, we have started the Michael Morpurgo text of Kensuke's Kingdom. So far we have engaged with what the story is about and thought carefully about different characters feelings in the learnt scenarios in the text.

In maths, we have been working on identifying factors and common factors. On Wednesday, we went outside to work on some Venn diagrams in groups to build on our knowledge.

On Monday, we joined with Year 6 to start to brainstorm some ideas for our Christmas games project that enables us to work collaboratively in our DT lessons.

Finally, we have enjoyed starting our sequences of Muslim culture. The Victorians and gymnastics in other parts of the curriculum. I have reminded all of the class that it is their responsibility to be bringing a coat each day as we will be hoping to remain outside when possible. Have a lovely weekend!

#### Year 6—Mr Davis

We have all enjoyed welcoming the children back into the classroom after half term. They were all rested and ready to go! In English, we have started a new sequence on Beowulf. The children have listened to the story and considered their likes and dislikes as well as making connections between this story and all of the other (super) hero stories they have encountered. The children then had a go at writing their own section of the story using a blueprint that we created.

In maths, we have continued our sequence on the four operations by learning three different methods for long division. I have been particularly impressed with the children's resilience and perseverance when tackling this tricky operation.

In ICT, the children have also started a new sequence - 3D Modelling. We have had our first two lessons (one replacing PE due to the horrible weather) using the TinkerCAD software. Year 6 again showed great resilience learning to use a new program and honing their design skills in a number of challenges.


In PE, with Mr Walter, Year 6 are learning about movement and control through gymnastics. This week involved considering the different muscle groups and how different stretches and moves can activate them - it looked very strenuous! Years 5 and 6 combined in their first Design and Technology lesson of the term.

They have been put into groups and assigned a game or activity to design and make for the Christmas Fair at the end of term. It was lovely to see the children

collaborating and seeking to improve further on last year's success.

Finally, in Science, the children have started a unit of work on Electricity. They were very impressive in their abilities to recall knowledge from Years 4 and 5, ready to learn more over the next six weeks.

Have a great weekend. Enjoy the fireworks!








