Dear Parents and Carers,

I can't believe we are now at half term, we have certainly had an exciting and fun filled time. Each class has been on a trip to enrich the curriculum. #### Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

We have all dared to be different today and enjoyed welcoming you to our classroom this morning. We hope everyone has a lovely half term break.







This week we wrote our own journey stories based on a trip around Winkleigh. We have been focusing on what makes a good sentence, remembering to check for a capital letter, full stop and adding finger spaces between the words. At the end of the week we had a go at editing our writing independently, making any changes we can to improve our work further. After the half term break we will be changing to a new text in our English, a non-fiction book entitled 'Knights'.

In Maths we have worked on our addition, talking about starting with the largest number when adding two numbers together. We also subtracted from a whole to find a part, using objects and maths resources to support us with that learning. At the end of the week we revisited the work we had covered previously learning about fact families, this time extending our learning to cover eight different facts in a family.

We completed our learning about technology around us in Computing this half term. We have learned to name all the different parts of a laptop and desktop computer and we know what technology means. We had opportunities to use a trackpad and keyboard. After half term we will be creating digital artwork.

#### Year 2-Miss Jones

We have come to the end of the first half term and it's been another very busy week.


In English we have begun our new non-fiction sequence all about penguins. This week we have learned actions to go with a text map, learned and applied key vocabulary in a glossary and have thought about writing questions and answers, focusing on the use of correct punctuation.

In Maths we have continued with addition and subtraction and have been showing our workings by drawing tens and ones to add and subtract a two-digit number and a one-digit number.

Our English sequence has fitted nicely alongside our Geography sequence about Antarctica and habitats in Science.

We have been completing assessment tasks in the foundation subjects ready to begin our new sequences of learning when we return to school.

#### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

What a fantastic half term it has been in Year 3! We have learnt all about column addition this week, building up from 2-digit to 3-digit numbers, with exchanges. After half term, our focus will turn towards column subtraction.

English has seen us produce our own independent writing, based on the story of the Lord of the Forest. The Tiger in the story travels around the forest, searching for the Lord of the Forest, meeting several animals before discovering that he is the Lord! The children have chosen their own animals that the tiger meets and re-told the story with their twist.

We have been busy completing our assessment tasks in the foundation subjects this week and I have been impressed with the amount of learning the children have retained.

They have shown off their understanding around volcanoes, earthquakes, different rock types and much more!

It's been great to see everyone in their 'different' outfits today, have a lovely, restful half term and I look forward to seeing you all in a week!





#### Year 4-Miss McLean

Year Four have had a fantastic week to end their first half term. They have worked hard to show their knowledge in our end of sequence tasks this week.

In English, we have finished our poetry sequence by writing some independent poetry based on the poems we have looked at from Poetry Pie. After half term, we will be moving on to our next sequence based on Myth Atlas by Thiago de Moraes.

In maths, we have finished our addition and subtraction sequence by learning what the key word efficient means and how we can check that our answers are correct using the inverse. After half term, we will be moving onto a short sequence on area followed by multiplication and division.

In science on Monday the children worked in their table teams to carry out the experiment that they planned last week. They worked collaboratively to find out if the temperature of some water changed the time that it took for an ice cube to melt.

Well done for a fantastic start Year Four, have a wonderful weekend!

#### Year 5—Mr Walter

I cannot believe where this term has gone! Year 5 have really worked hard this week to finish our learning sequences. In English, the teamwork shown to finish our spelling activity games have really helped develop an understanding of spelling patterns and new work meanings. Using this knowledge, we have planned out and written our independent stories that include a selection of words we have learnt.

In maths, we have started to explore the meanings of prime, squared and cubed numbers as well as finding common multiples in various numbers. In music, everyone has engaged with learning a song and making some Halloween based artwork to perform together. Finally, in geography everyone has thought carefully about tourism on mountains and created a leaflet including facts, location, climate and activities that can be completed. Well done to everyone this term, enjoy your break!







#### Year 6-Mr Davis

Year 6 have had an excellent week to finish their first half term at the end of Key Stage 2. In English, we finished our sequence on the opera Aidan by rewriting a story using the characters from the performance—Aidan, Dorian, Melissa and Olivia. The children were challenged to include some of the comedy and tragedy elements in their work.

In maths, the children have revised short division before moving on to using factors to divide three- and four-digit numbers. In Science this week, the children learnt that white light is made up of a spectrum of colours and that each colour has a different frequency and wave length. Year 6 have worked particularly hard in Geography this week. Their final project was to

design and draw a new eco-settlement at Dolton Cross on an ordnance survey map. They then had to justify their decisions using 6-figure grid references. The work that the class has produced is outstanding.

Thank you to all of you that attended parents evening this week. It was great to be able to share the really positive start that all of the children have made this year. Also, thanks to the adults who joined us for our open morning today. I know the class enjoyed sharing their work and showing the opera to you.

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
