This was the last week of our 'Happy and Healthy' topic.

On Monday we reminded ourselves of all the 'ingredients' we need to keep ourselves happy and healthy, from daily exercise, eating a balanced diet and keeping our bodies clean, to enjoying the occasional foodie treat and having lots of fun playing with our friends and enjoying quality time with our families. We all agreed that fun and laughter always makes us feel happy.

During circle time discussions we talked about how we can keep where we live 'happy and healthy' too. We followed the story of The Messy Magpie as she discovered the difference between what we throw away as rubbish/refuse and recycling. We learnt that recycling is good because it means that we have less rubbish littering our local community and the wider world. This helps to protect animals and their homes by making sure less rubbish ends up in places like forests or seas. It can also mean that fewer trees are chopped down to make new things. ## Year 1—Mrs Betts & Mrs Rowcliffe



Another brilliant but busy week in year 1. We have started our new English topic 'Writing a cumulative story'. **'What does cumulative mean?'** This is based on Mrs Armitage and the Big Wave by Quentin Blake. So far this week, we have been sequencing parts of story and looking at writing noun phrases to add our description to our writing. Additionally, we looked at humour and what and why things make us laugh - exploring how we can add this to our story as well.



Maths this week built on last weeks' doubling by examining halving through sharing between two. We are beginning to look at division. In music the children have really enjoyed playing accompaniment to a song using the online glockenspiel thinking about the tempo and pulse. In Science year 1 have been using specific vocabulary to describe the properties of materials. **'What vocabulary could you use to describe your window?'**



In RE this week, Mrs Rowcliffe has been introducing children to the Jewish 'Shabbat' the day of rest. **I wonder if you can remember what day of the week this is for the Jewish community?'**

Year 1 have been working incredibly hard on their phonics and we are now seeing the progress that the children are making. We really are very proud of their continued hard work.



Continuing with our programming of robots the children have been sequencing instructions for the robot and predicting where commands will take the robot. They have been using commands go, delete memory, forwards, backwards, left and right. Hopefully, the children will remember **'What is the most important button on the bee bot/ blue bot?'**

We are continuing to think about developing growth mindsets and the importance of resilience. **'What is resilience?'**  
Have a fabulous weekend year 1.


## Year 2—Miss Jones

## Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Once again, I have been impressed by the mature attitude towards learning in Year 3 this week! We have continued our sequence on time in maths. We are now experts on identifying time to the nearest minute, 5 minutes and using am, pm and the 24-hour clock. **Can you tell the time this weekend?** Our monsters have been made in English yesterday – thank you to everyone who donated cardboard tubes! We have applied our prior learning on imperative verbs and time adverbials to practise writing a set of instructions. We have worked together to begin our shared version of a manual for caring for a monster.

Next week we will be planning and crafting our own independent writing. We are really looking forward to the Space Dome on Tuesday and being joined by our friends from Kings Nympton. It will be a fantastic opportunity to begin to get to know them before our joint camping residential, which is fast approaching!

In science, we have learnt about the life cycle of a plant from soil to seed dispersal. We have also re-potted our snap dragon plants that were kindly given to us by RHS Rosemoor. **I wonder how well your nasturtiums are growing at home?** It's been great to see all the reading at home, independently and with adults that has happened this week! ## Year 4—Miss McLean

It has been a busy week in Year Four this week! We have come to the end of our sequence of learning on decimals in maths. We have learnt how to order and round decimals by using the key word 'integer'. Next week, we will be moving onto a short sequence on money. In English, the children have enjoyed getting to know the story of the Whistling Monster by creating freeze frames of the key parts and coming up with actions to help them remember the setting description. We also had a quick recap of how to correctly punctuate fronted adverbials. On Monday, we used a dichotomous key in science to sort living things by asking yes and no questions. In computing this week, we created algorithms to make a square. We discussed an efficient way of doing this is to use a repeat function to draw 4 sides in one command. Finally this week, Year Four have worked hard on understanding how to be a supportive friend on the playground. We came up with a variety of ways to look out for each other to make sure everyone feels involved.

## Year 5—Mr Walter

Year 5 have worked extremely hard this week across the curriculum. In English, we have been exploring the inclusion of parenthesis to add extra information to our board game reports. Whereas in maths we are extending our knowledge of angles on a straight line and in triangles, to reason how we find the angles and properties of quadrilaterals.

In art, everyone was able to design the net of a 3D shape using the works of Escher for inspiration. These were then connected together to make small paper sculptures.

Additionally, we had a go at following instructions to make origami designs.

Luckily, the sun was out when we went outside in science this week; as we investigated shadows to help us explain how night and day occur. We were shocked to see the difference of time across the world.

Finally, in geography we have all chosen a company or influential figure to write a persuasive letter to regarding climate change. We researched some powerful messages by Sir David Attenborough and Greta Thunberg to help us construct our letters. The attitude to this was fantastic and many children have decided to continue their writing at home.

## Year 6—Mr Davis

It has been really nice to get back to some sort of normality after the SATs last week. In English, we have been focussing on the Greek mythological stories of The Trojan War and Odysseus's Voyage. The children have been working on characterisation - how they can explain the character of Odysseus to their readers whilst writing in the first person. I have been particularly impressed with the vocabulary they have generated.

In maths, we have returned to our sequence on perimeter, area and volume. We have been learning how to calculate the area of right-angled triangles by considering how they are half a quadrilateral. In Science, we have been learning about our body's double circulatory system and how the heart pumps oxygenated blood through the aorta. In RE, Year 6 have been writing a balanced newspaper report considering a famous religious experience and how it may be perceived by theists and atheists.

Finally, we had a visit from PCSO Sandra Brown. She came to talk to Years 5 and 6 about anti-social behaviour. She discussed what these behaviours included, how to report them and how the crimes can be escalated by the police. She then also gave children a Q and A session on weapons - particularly knife crime - and what they can do to keep themselves safe. Have a lovely weekend!

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

**You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.**
