### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

In Owls Class this week, the children have enjoyed listening to a range of different stories as part of their learning. They have learnt that everyone is good at something different and that practise makes perfect with the help of Gerald the Giraffe from the story 'Giraffes Can't Dance'. They have listened to stories about Elmer the Elephant and learnt that it's good to be different. They thoroughly enjoyed going on a colour hunt around the school on Tuesday in an attempt to find all the colours of Elmer!

In RE, they listened to a story about Eeyore's birthday and talked about their own birthday celebrations. In maths this week they have continued to enjoy singing and acting out a number of different counting rhymes, and particularly enjoyed fishing and sending aliens flying off into space!

Next week we will begin adding phonics lessons into our daily routine. Information will be sent home each week about the letters and sounds learnt in class so that you are able to support your children at home.

Also next week as part of our SCARF topic we will be talking about things that are special to us. We would love it if the children could bring in something that is special to them to talk about as part of our lesson on Thursday. This could be a special toy or a book for example. Please can we ask that nothing breakable or of value is sent in! Thank you.

Please can we ask that the children practise putting on and taking off jumpers by themselves over the weekend. ### Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

After a brilliant first week of English learning about Dolly Parton, this week we began reading 'Oi Frog!'. We will cover this text for three weeks. We loved reading the book and identifying all the rhyming words. Then towards the end of the week we focused on the frog and cat characters, thinking about adjectives to describe them. We also learned about questions and when to use a question mark in our writing.



In Maths we have been continuing our learning about number and place value. We have enjoyed lots of practical activities, counting forwards and backwards and working out one more and one less than a given number.



Our Geography this half term focuses on our local area. We looked at where Winkleigh is on a map and also used Google Earth to zoom in and out. We learned new vocabulary including county, country and continent. If you have time at the weekend and can access Google Earth, the children really enjoy seeing their house on the screen and it is great for visualising the local area around us.



In Computing we are learning about the word 'technology' and what it means. Some of us were really surprised to learn that even a pair of scissors is classed as technology! This is because technology is 'something that helps us and was made by humans.' *Can you find any examples of technology in your home?*

### Year 2—Miss Jones



It's been a busy first week and it's great to see the children settle into being in Year 2. In English we have been completing our final piece of writing all about Jane Goodall. We have been focusing on starting to develop our writing stamina and apply the Year 2 common exception words in our writing, something that we have all picked up on really well.

In Maths we have continued with our place value sequence and have looked at partitioning two-digit numbers as well as counting in 10s and 1s on a number line.



In Geography we consolidated our understanding of hot and cold places in the world, linking to what we know about the location of the equator. In Science we sorted objects into living, dead or never alive, linking to our living things and their habitats topic.

It was lovely to welcome the Year 2 parents into school for our welcome meeting on Monday, I hope it was useful and gave you an insight into the year ahead.

#### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have had a fantastic first couple of weeks back! They are really showing their maturity as they settle into our routines and expectations.

English has seen us write about the life of Marcus Rashford, creating an excellent display in the corridor. We have focused, this week, on the life of Queen Elizabeth, learning more about her legacy.

In maths, we have begun our sequence based on place value. This has involved representing numbers to 100 and to 1000 using a range of resources. Rocks and soils are the focus of our first science sequence, we have discovered more about different types of rocks including igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary. We learnt about the structure of the Earth in geography, labelling the different layers and considering how they differ. Great work Year 3, keep it up!

### Year 4—Miss McLean

Year Four have made a fantastic start to the year and have already impressed me with their positive attitude towards their learning.

We have completed our introduction sequence in English, based on the book 'Fantastically Great Women who Changed the World' and the children have written some wonderful, well-structured biographies about Marie Curie. We have started our first sequence of learning in English which is based on the book 'The Great Kapok Tree'. This book will support our learning in Geography about Rainforests.

In maths we have begun our place value sequence by looking at 4-digit numbers. We have used dienes and place value counters to make numbers with thousands, hundreds, tens and ones.

As well as this, we have started our new sequences in all of the foundation subjects, more information about these can be found on the school website by looking at the subject overview sheets.

Well done for such a positive start to the year, Year Four!

#### Year 5—Mr Walter

Year 5 have had a fantastic first week back at school. Everyone has returned with a real desire to get started with their learning which has led to some amazing discussions and work already.

In English, we have been researching and writing a biography on either Rosa Parks, Harriet Tubman or Martin Luther King Jnr. We have learnt all about their stories to help strengthen our understanding of the Civil Rights Movement. Some of our writing and images will be placed on our corridor display.

In maths, we have been strengthening our understanding of place value while partitioning numbers up to one million. Elsewhere in the curriculum we have been finding where the major mountains are around the world and looking into magnetic objects around the school in science.

On Wednesday, Miss Parsons worked with the class to create their own eco-art looking into the works of Tony Cragg as a focus artist.

It was great to have the opportunity to speak to some of you at the welcome meeting on Wednesday, thank you for attending. I hope you all have a great weekend.









#### Year 6—Mr Davis

Year 6 have had a fantastic first full week in Year 6. All of the staff have been so impressed with their efforts in lessons and the fantastic example they have been setting to the other children in the school - so well done to all of them. In English this week, we have finished our first teaching sequence about the Civil Rights Movement in America. The class have engaged with the challenging subject matter well and have showed great empathy and understanding. We have performed 'The Hill we Climb' by Amanda Gorman as well as having a go at writing their own poems in her style. In Maths, the children have been ordering numbers, calculating using the powers of ten and demonstrating their understanding of place value using a variety of resources. In Science this week, the children have learnt how light travels and the basics of how our eyes receive the information. They will be conducting an experiment using this knowledge next week. PE this week involved the children improving their close ball control in hockey - as well at their peripheral vision. In Geography, Year 6 have learnt about ordnance survey maps - starting with the 'legend' that contains all of the symbols and what they mean. They then had to look at a map of Winkleigh





and see how many of the symbols they could discover. Finally, in PSHE, Year 6 have been running an 'Agony Aunt' radio phone-in for peers with friendship issues. Again, nice to hear the children being empathetic and compassionate to one another. Have a great weekend all.

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- · Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
