This week we made our own Christmas decorations using lolly sticks and pipe cleaners. This enabled us to complete our sequence of learning in English, writing our own set of instructions. We finished the week by following instructions to make snowflakes to decorate our classroom.

In Maths we have been consolidating our learning and focused on counting objects and recognising numbers as words. *Can you write numbers 1-10 in word form?* 

In PSHE we have been thinking about who is special to us. We discussed this as a class during circle time and then made a card for that special person.

We are also very busy putting the final touches to our Christmas Play and look forward to sharing it with you next week!



### Year 2-Miss Jones

This week the children have been busy doing assessments in Reading, Maths and SPaG. We have been really impressed with their perseverance and hard work!

## Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have had a brilliant week, working really hard on their assessment quizzes in class. I have been impressed with the children's recall of key learning. In the meantime, we have continued our sequence around Mog's Christmas Calamity in English. We are really enjoying the story and have spent time learning about sentence structure, speech, conjunctions and adjectives this week. We will be applying each of these concepts in our independent writing in the coming weeks.

We have learnt about the four times table and multiplying by eight this week in maths. We will be focusing on learning mental arithmetic strategies over the next couple of weeks to support our calculations. During D&T, we made, or helped our peers to make, our instruments this week. The children worked hard and used their resilience to create their designs. We learnt about water and air resistance in science, drawing force diagrams to demonstrate our understanding. History saw us think about Egyptian gods, why they were worshipped and making comparisons with other civilisations we know about.

We are really looking forward to our trip to Exeter next Thursday! Have a great, restful weekend.









### Year 4—Miss McLean

Year Four have worked incredibly hard on their quizzes this week and have amazed me with their resilience when having a go at some tricky questions.

In maths on Thursday and Friday, we had a go at some multiplication investigations. The children worked with each other to explain what they had found out and how they came to their conclusions. In English, we got to know our new text 'The Snow Globe' by making a story map and discussing the characters emotions and how they changed throughout the story. In history this week, we became researchers to find out the answers to some questions about Mayan everyday life. The children used books, the internet and fact sheets to find out what the Mayans ate, what types of buildings they lived in and whether they went to school or not. In D&T on Thursday afternoon, we started to use our designs to make a board game. We discussed the reasons for using a square frame structure as a solid base for a game before having a go at making one. We will continue to work on these next week.

Finally, Christmas arrived in our classroom this week! The children are all looking forward to







the events that are coming up during the next two weeks in school.

### Year 5-Mr Walter

Christmas has hit Year 5!! With the help of Miss Parsons the classroom has been transformed into a Christmas wonderland.

Everyone has worked fantastically in their NFERs this week, taking care and applying their knowledge throughout.

In science this week, we have been experimenting the oxidation of an apple in different substances. Each day we have been checking to see the changes of the apple (it stinks of vinegar).

In DT, we started to construct materials with our Year 6 groups for our Christmas fair. **Some children were interested to bring things from home, we have asked they check with you first.** 

In RE, we have started a discussion about the meaning of Christmas and how it is celebrated across religions. While in PHSE we have worked on a jigsaw of the United Kingdom to show the differences of culture, language and more.

## Year 6—Mr Davis

It has been assessment week in Year 6 this week. The children have undertaken their first

set of practice SATs which are, of course, designed for the end of the year. I would like to say how pleased I am with the children's application, effort, maturity and resilience when dealing with a new type of assessment. So well done to all of them. These assessments will be reflected in their reports.

In DT this week, Year 6 combined with their Year 5 teammates to start the designing and building process of their Christmas Fair games. It was fantastic to see them collaborating and working really hard as groups to achieve their goals. I know they are really looking forward to welcoming children from the rest of the school to their event in just over a week's time.

In Science, Year 6 have continued to look at practical applications for circuits and components in the world. This week, they have looked at the circuit for a burglar alarm. They started by looking at the alarm system in school before considering what the circuit might look like. Finally, before creating a circuit diagram to demonstrate their understanding, they learnt how conductive materials can be used to complete a circuit over a window or door by creating a contact point. In PSHE, the children have been building on their knowledge of what it means to be assertive and thinking about respect - both in and out of the classroom. Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over

Are you entitled?

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
