The children loved learning about the tradition of Wassailing on Wednesday. They made crowns, sang Wassail songs, threaded bread to feed the robins, danced around the orchard and toasted the trees with apple juice! What a lovely way to spend the afternoon Owls!

Year 1— Mrs Keast & Mrs Betts

This week in English we used the Story Box puzzle pieces to plan a story. We thought about how we could use time adverbials and noun phrases in our writing. Next week we will complete this sequence and write our own independent stories.

In Maths we have been working on number lines and how to use them. On Wednesday we played a fun game on the iPad which involved estimating where a number would be positioned on a blank number line. We have also been comparing numbers and using words such as 'greater' and 'fewer'. Next week we will be moving on to addition and subtraction within 20.

In Art we continued with our circular theme after last week's learning about Wassily Kandinsky. We had paper plate weaving looms and created our own woven design using wool. This took a lot of concentration and patience!

In Geography we learned about Wales and how St David's Day is celebrated. We also ate some yummy Welsh cakes and learned how to say our colours in Welsh.

Next week we look forward to a special Science day on Thursday and have some fun practical experiments to try out!







Year 2—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Betts

Year 2s have continued to work on the text of Little Red Riding Hood. They have learn about verbs—being, having or doing words and how they sound in the past tense. Using last week's noun phrases they have written sentences in the past tense. They have invested their own character and decided how they will overcome the wolf!

In maths we have continued to learn about money, adding it up, comparing amounts and partitioning it into pounds and pence.

In science, they have learnt about the life cycle of a human, drawing pictures of themselves as babies, toddlers and young children and predicting what they will look like when they are older, what they will do and hobbies they will have.

In computing we looked at how computer programmes can help us to make rhythm and pulse. We used chrome music lab to combine rhythm and pulse.

Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have worked hard this week on their learning across the curriculum. In English, we have planned and written our own versions of Hansel and Gretel, utilising key vocabulary and previously taught grammar to enhance our work.

Maths has seen us finish our multiplication and division sequence before moving on to studying length and perimeter. We have been busy measuring various items, ensuring that our rulers line up with 0cm rather than just at the end.

In science, we thought about what magnets are and how they interact with each other. Meanwhile, on Thursday, we walked around the village in geography to learn more about the local area, noticing and identifying human and physical geographical features.

We worked hard in art to apply the technique of Sgraffito to our work, noticing how it could add

texture and change the atmosphere of the painting.

Year 4—Miss McLean

The highlight of the week for Year Four this week was their workshops on Wednesday morning. During the first workshop, the children took part in some activities involving matching items to the natural resources that they were made from. They then looked at what happens to the rubbish that we make and how we can recycle materials and turn them into new items. In the second workshop, they had a go at making their own paper which they took home yesterday.

In maths this week, we have finished our sequence on multiplication and division. Next week, we will move on to length and perimeter.

We have also come to the end of a sequence in English. The children worked hard on their independent non-fiction writing and created some interesting texts about how to care for a yeti. Next week, we will begin looking at the book 'Blue John' by Berlie Doherty.

In science this week, we practiced making some electrical circuits and learnt how to draw circuit diagrams and the symbols that are used to represent each component.

Year 5—Mr Walter

This week in English, we have finished our learning sequence of the lost words. We wrote our own spells using poetic devices based on something from nature.

In maths, we have continued to find equivalent fractions to help us subtract different calculations. We learnt about the importance to look after our marine environment and had a go at playing the F chord on a ukulele.



Finally, we have explored the landscapes of well known artists while describing the importance to keep ourselves safe online.

Year 6—Mr Davis

In English this week, Year 6 have been considering how JK Rowling describes the wonders of the world she has created. The children have been practising and applying modal verbs, relative clauses and expanded noun phrases to their work - including writing advice for first year pupils in role as a Hogwarts prefect.

In Maths, we have started our next teaching sequence - Decimals. Year 6 have been ordering, rounding, adding and subtracting this week. In Art, Year 6 have been honing their print making skills by experimenting by making indents in polystyrene sheets and thinking about negative space and a reverse image.

In ICT, the class have learnt about data packets and how electronic devices send information to each other (and how they are made private). In PSHE, the learning centred around an NSPCC video and the importance of thinking before sharing images of yourself or others on social media

Finally, in Science, the children learnt about Carl Linnaeus and his method of classifying animals - which is used all over the world (especially in Chinese zoos!).

As Clerk to Governors you will provide advice to the governing board and its individual members on governance, constitutional and procedural matters.

You will provide administrative support to the governing board, its committees and individual governors to facilitate effective and efficient meetings by organising and attending meetings, providing the agenda and minuting the meeting.

You will manage information effectively and facilitate and co-ordinate the induction process for new governors and promote governor training.

Should I keep my

child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- · Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
