

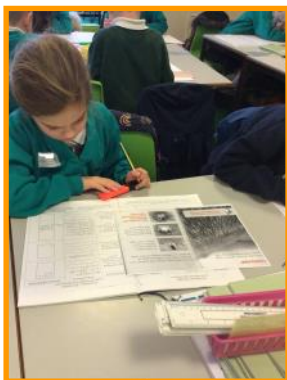


Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

Year One have had a fabulous first week back. We enjoyed a visit from a Dentist on Wednesday and we have had great fun in our two PE sessions at the end of the week. In English we have begun a new text 'A Dog's Day' by Rebecca Rissman. We love how the book is actually two versions of the same events, told through the eyes of both Rusty and Rosie. We have been learning to retell the story with actions. In Maths we have been working on subtraction and 'fact families' - writing 8 linked addition and subtraction number sentences. In History we begin a new unit of learning about toys from the past. ***If anyone has any interesting old toys at home that we could use to view in class that would be very exciting.*** In Computing we are beginning to learn to use paint to create digital drawings and that is something that you could try at home using the free Paintz website (<https://paintz.app>). ***Finally a reminder that we will change library books on a Thursday afternoon, please try and pop them back into your book bags every Thursday.***



Year 2—Miss Jones



It's been a busy first week back after half term. In English we have explored non-fiction text types. We used highlighters to identify headings, page numbers, facts and pictures/illustrations from example pages in the text. We then started our shared write ready to plan our independent piece of writing next week.

In Maths we consolidated column method and used hundred squares and bead strings to help us when adding and subtracting two-digit numbers. We then began exploring the concept of exchanging practically at the end of the week. It was a week of new learning through our elicitation booklets.

In History we started to look at explorers and discussed what we thought what equipment explorers might use in the past and present. In Science we are continuing with living things and their habitats. In this half of the term we are studying specific habitats in more detail. In Computing we explored digital photography. We looked at some different cameras and decided whether they were from the past or present. In D&T we started our fridge magnet sequence. For our elicitation we thought about what could be held on a fridge and what the purpose of fridge magnets are.

Preparations for the Year 1 and 1 Christmas play are underway! We have started to learn the songs which is very exciting. Have a good weekend everyone.

Year 3—Mr Slocombe



It has been great to welcome everyone back this week. We have learnt our new text 'Interview with a Tiger' and have focused on key vocabulary from the text. We have also written a character profile for the tiger and thought about using conjunctions to improve and extend our writing.

In maths, we are coming to the end of our addition and subtract sequence. We have used the inverse to check calculations, found near numbers to make estimations and found complements to 100.

In science, we have completed our elicitation task and thought about pushes, pulls and forces.

We have also begun our new sequence all about the Ancient Egyptians, we made inferences about the lives of the Egyptians and what images of artefacts from the civilisation can teach us.

We are busy all week and this afternoon, we have begun our Spanish unit by learning the numbers 0-10. Then we completed our weekly retrieval quiz, to remind ourselves of all the things we have learnt this week. Keep up all the fantastic home learning with reading at home and Times Tables Rock Stars.

Finally, we have started learning a poem that we will be reading at the War Memorial on Friday next week. Have a super weekend.



Year 4—Miss McLean



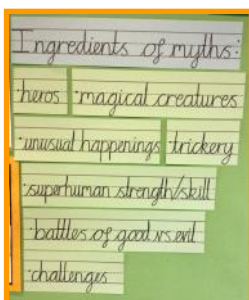
Year Four have had a lovely first week back after half term! The children have all been interested to find out what our new sequences of learning are for this half term and have enjoyed completing our elicitation tasks. In maths, we have completed a short unit on area and will be starting our sequence on multiplication and division next week.

In English, we have begun a learning sequence based on the book 'Myth atlas'. So far, we have discussed the 'ingredients of a myth' and what makes them different from other fictional stories. We learnt one of the myths from the book and put actions with it to help us bring it to life.

In science, we are continuing to learn about states of matter. This week, we learnt a song to help us remember the key vocabulary *evaporation*, *condensation* and *precipitation* as part of the water cycle.

In history, we listened to a story about how the ancient Mayan civilisation was discovered by Spanish explorers and came up with some questions that we would like to find out the answers to about the Mayan civilisation.

Finally, on Thursday afternoon we finished making our remembrance poppies. The children are all looking forward to wearing these next week to show their respect. Have a wonderful weekend all!

Year 5—Mr Walter

Year 5 have worked hard on their return to school this week!

In English, we have been looking into the key features of poems and spells in the text “The Lost Words”. This has allowed us to explore the uses of alliteration, rhyme and repetition. In maths, we have been distinguishing the differences between multiples and factors. This has allowed us to find the lowest common multiples and identify the highest common factors of pairs of numbers.

In addition, this week we have completed various elicitation tasks to highlight our understanding and knowledge of each foundation subject. In DT, we have started our collaboration project with Year 6 to plan this year’s Christmas fair games and in PE, we have started our sequence focussing on gymnastics. This allows us to focus on the discipline and controlled elements of using our body.

Year 6—Mr Davis

I hope you all had a lovely half term break and that the children were all reading and raring to get back to school.

In English this week, we have been finishing our teaching sequence on Beowulf. The children have been challenged with planning and writing their own section of a monster story using the blueprint and grammatical techniques we have been studying this term. Their outcomes have been very impressive!

In Maths, we have finished our sequence on the four operations by looking at BODMAS and the order of operations, by looking at questions that have required the children to think about what they know and consider a method that is efficient and, finally, to apply their estimating skills to help them make an educated mathematical guess.

In ICT, Year 6 have started their latest sequence of work on 3D modelling. The children have had the chance to experiment with the software and test its limits. In History, the first sequence of Year 6 is about the Tudors. Year 6 learnt about how the Tudor period started - at the Battle of Bosworth.

In Science, Year 6 have also started a new sequence - electricity. The first lesson centred around the role of the cell in a circuit and how to draw circuit diagrams correctly.

Finally, Year 6 have been collaborating with Year 5 on this term's design and technology project - planning, creating and running this year's Christmas fair games. They will be working closely together this term in this subject and this week was a really good start! It has been a fantastic week - Year 6 have come back after the break with a fantastic attitude.

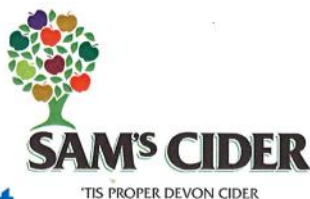

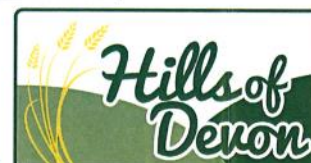

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
