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A note from the Head

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am so proud when I look back on this last year at school. The Autumn term seems so long ago now and the children, though smaller in stature, came to us eager to learn within the ethos of their new classes and the school. Each child has had an incredible journey, rising to challenge and navigating through their friendships and learning from exciting lessons prepared by their teachers. Our incredible team of staff have supported children in both these aspects of school life and we have seen brilliant engagement with learning and great progress this year. All of this was validated by Ofsted, who remarked on some of the excellent experiences our children receive here. The two inspectors spent two very full days scrutinizing the curriculum, safeguarding (described as tenacious), children's personal development, teachers and the leadership of the school. Children's personal development has grown through much learning across the curriculum using discussions, debating and enrichment. - Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
