Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

In Owls Class this week, the children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about Bonfire Night and the Gunpowder Plot. They have created some fantastic fireworks pictures using a range of different media, and have really enjoyed re-telling the story, building the houses of parliament in different ways and dressing up as King James I.

In phonics, the children have spelt out fireworks words using magnetic letters and have practised their letter formation to write these down. Our maths this week has focused on 2D shapes. The children have sorted shapes, described shapes and used shapes to make rockets for our classroom display.

This week the children have learnt 4 new tricky words! *Please check your emails for ideas of ways to help your child learn and remember these tricky words*. We enjoyed looking at photos of the children as babies this week, linking this to The Nativity story and thinking about gifts that Jesus was given and how babies are special. We have one photo in class which we are having trouble matching to a child! If you are missing a picture please let us know!

Next week we will be learning about the Hindu festival of Diwali.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Year 1— Mrs Keast & Mrs Betts

This week we thought about the role of a Knight and what their daily life would involve. Then we considered modern-day job roles and what different jobs there are. We thought about the jobs we might like to do when we are older. As part of our research we wrote three questions to interview someone at home with, finding out more about their job role. Next week we will be writing about jobs and using the features of a non-fiction book in our writing.

In Maths we have worked really hard on our understanding of number bonds to 10. We enjoyed lots of practical learning opportunities, using Cuisenaire rods and making our own dominoes. *Can you tell someone at home all the number bonds? Can you do it systematically?*

We began our History this week and thought about toys. We considered the toys that we enjoy playing with today and also those that we enjoyed when we were a baby or a toddler. We are looking forward to our workshop next Thursday when Tiverton Museum come into school. We will be exploring lots of artefacts and having a go at making our own peg dolls.

Everyone looked great today in their red clothes. Sophie's Gran kindly made us some Remembrance poppies using old horseshoes and crochet. We enjoyed looking at them and they have been taken to Winkleigh Church to be viewed with the other memorial wreaths and poppies.







Year 2-Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

What a great week year 2 have had. We have worked really hard all week. In English, the Dragon Machine has inspired us to use detailed verbs, prepositional phrases and expanded noun phrases in our sentences. We have built them up across the week and we have now begun to retell the story in our own words.

In maths we have been consolidating our knowledge of how to take away a 1 digit number form a 2 digit number by using a number line and partitioning the 2s number. First we count back in 1s, from the start number, then re drew the jumps so we 'jumped' through the 10s number. We used the part whole model to work out how to partition the number we are taking away. In science, we loved learning about how species in the desert have adapted to be able to thrive in the extreme heat and dryness and created a great fact file.

In history, we thought about why people are significant, so we will understand how the explorers we will learn about over the next few weeks are 'significant'.

Spellings have been sent home on Monday, and tested today. Reading out loud is so important in year 2 and any chances you get to hear your child read has a huge impact on their reading skills. I check the reading record books on teacher led guided reading day, a dojo and sticker are given for every 5 reads at home!

Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have had a great week! A particular highlight was definitely skateboarding, everyone loved learning a new skill! Today, we have also visited the church to learn more about the importance of Remembrance day. As usual, Year 3 were a credit to the school and behaved beautifully. In English, we have continued with our sequence around Paddington. We have covered grammar elements this week including subordinate conjunctions and clauses, possessive apostrophes and the use of adverbs to add detail around when/where/how something happened.

Maths has seen us consolidate our knowledge of column addition and subtraction. This has been a tricky skill to learn but we are masters of it now! In history, we explored the River Nile, discovering lots of reasons why it was significant to the Ancient Egyptians. Next week, we will be using our knowledge of this to complete some extended writing.

Meanwhile, in science, we learnt more about friction, leading us to plan an investigation next week to test the friction caused by a range of different surfaces. Well done Year 3, have a lovely weekend!

Year 4-Miss McLean

Year Four have had another great week, the main highlights being their skateboarding workshop and our visit to the church this morning. The children loved taking part in the skateboarding workshop, getting to develop their skills further. They also enjoyed getting to wear their poppies that were made in art last half term which they will bring home today. They behaved fantastically during our church visit, they were very respectful and polite.

In English this week we have focused on adverbials. We learnt that adverbials describe a verb by adding information about where, when or how. We practiced using adverbials at the end of sentences as well as at the start to make fronted adverbials. *Can you remember what punctuation is used for a fronted adverbial?*

In maths, we have focused on multiples of 3 and 6 this week. As well as knowing the number facts, children have been noticing patterns in times tables to help them to remember them.

We looked at some Mayan artefacts in history this week and had a go at working out what they might be as well as what they told us about the Ancient Mayan Civilisation. We found out that they used tools and materials to make furniture, jewellery and weapons.

Year 5—Mr Walter

Year 5 have shown a fantastic attitude to their learning this week. In maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of cube numbers while practicing using various methods of multiplication. In English, we have focussed on using modal verbs to discuss a characters feelings of being isolated on an island. In history we were shocked to learn about the working conditions children faced in the Victorian times while in RE, we have compared two groups of the Islam culture.

On Wednesday, we enjoyed the opportunity to take part in the skateboarding workshop alongside our PE lessons this week.

Finally, everyone has shown a great maturity to write remembrance poems and artwork to take to the church today while paying their respects.

Year 6-Mr Davis

We have had an interesting if slightly drizzly week in Year 6. In English, the children have continued to learn using Beowulf as a key text. The children have been studying the techniques that the author uses to add atmosphere to their writing - particularly the Power of Three. Year 6 identified that that power of three could range from adjectives, to nouns, to phrases. Finally, the children created their own antagonist monochrome image to inspire their future story writing.

In Maths, the children have finished their sequence on the four operations. They have all made excellent progress learning some new and tricky calculation strategies - so well done. We will be revisiting these techniques throughout the year.

In PE this week, the children practised some of the key skills and strategies required to play football without getting the footballs out. They have working on their marking skills (both man-to-man and zonal) and considered the appropriate strategies for both.

In History this week, Year 6 have started their sequence on the Tudors by researching the key facts during the period. These included the monarchs, the battles and other key events that define the Tudor period.

We were very lucky to have Adam from Team Rubicon Skateboarding come to visit us on Thursday. The whole class received a Dojo point as Adam said as he was leaving that he

wished he could teach this lot everyday. High praise indeed! Year 6's second Science lesson had them learning the theory behind power cells, volts, amps and different components. Next week, we will put these theories into practice by creating some purposeful circuits. I hope you all have a great weekend.
